John Patricks Will

In the name of God amen I John Patrick of Northampton
County being at present in perfect sound mind & memory
thanks be to god for it therefore calling unto mind the mor-
tality of my Body do make and ordain this my last will
& testament in maner, & form following first of all I do declare
that all my actual debts be paid before my Estate distribution
Then I give the use of my plantation to my wife Martha
Patrick during her widowhood when I have bin and the
Will & all the land thereunto belonging also the labour of
four negroes Olive, Burwell, Emma, Sidney also a mare
saddle and Bridle also three cows & calves three hens and
hambos one feather bed & furniture also thirty head of Hog
one Iron pot & ying pan one chest two spoons Basins
two dishes four plates one wooden wheel one linen wheel
& all the Lard in the plantation all the corn & meat on the
plantation at my death

Then I give the use of my plantation to my son Thomas Patrick my negro
woman named Siley & her increase to him this his heirs forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my son John Patrick two hundred acres
of land whereon he now lives to him this his heirs forever also one
negro boy named Eljah to him this his heirs forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my daughter Charity Lapite my
negro girl named Hannah to her this his heirs forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my son Paul Patrick one negro
girl named Palmer & one whip saw to him this his heirs
forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my son Ephraim Patrick one negro
girl named Nance to him this his heirs forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my son John Patrick my plantation
whereon I now live containing fifty two acres

also my first mill also my son Lawrence and my grand
son Daniel Patrick have all this their grand father
as long as they are in reach of the mill my son John to receive
his gift when my wife is dead and if then I say to John
and his heirs forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my son John Patrick one hundred
of fifty acres of land being the remainder part of my young
woods land to him this his heirs forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my son John Patrick my negro
man Dick Hall & his heirs to him this his heirs forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my daughter Phoebe Patrick my
negro girl named Lydia to her this his heirs forever

Then I give the use of my plantation to my son Lawrence Patrick one
hundred acres of land whereon he now lives to him this his heirs forever also two cows three Burwell & young
to him this his heirs forever also my black Smiths tools to my
son Lawrence and his heirs forever also my mare called
pleasant saddle & bridle to my son Lawrence

Then I give the use of my plantation to my grand son Daniel Patrick two
hundred acres of land whereon his father died to him also one
negro woman named Olive only for my grand son Nathan
Patrick to have the first living child she bears & then to
Daniel & his heirs forever also my grand son Daniel
Patrick one mare called Phoebe one cow & calf one ewe &
Lamb one washing tub & axe

Then I give the use of my plantation to my two grand children William
Eden & Elizabeth Eden fifty pounds to be equally divided
between them when they are twenty years of age no heirs no gift

Then I give the use of my plantation to my daughter Martha Patrick
one negro girl named Emma also one horse called
Spark one saddle & bridle to her this his heirs forever
as for the remainder part of my Estate within two years
without days I give to my daughter Martha Patrick
and his heirs forever

And I do appoint my three sons Thomas Patrick John
Patrick & Paul Patrick to be my executors of this my last
will & testament, as a ruling & managing of all other
matters as related this twentieth day of November last 1788.

Hart Arthur Will

In the name of God amen. I Arthur Hart of North Carolina
& in Northampton County being in perfect sense & memory do
ordain this my last will & testament in order & manner
as follows to wit

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Warren Hart the plantation
he now lives on and two Negroes James & Charity to him
his heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Henry Hart the plantation
he now lives on & two Negroes Eliza & Frank to him his
heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Wright Hart the plantation
I now live on containing 476 acres of our Negroes Dudley
Jerry, Jacob Ephraim & Charity two cows & calves
clams & white man the married & twelve head of hogs
& one feather Bed & furniture to him his heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath unto my son Robert Hart five
Negroes, Leazar, Anthony, Adia, Jack & Willy to him his
heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Isham Hart all my piney
wood land on the north side of Goosehawk Crag, Philles
Tally, Sude & Adams two bag fillings four hundred
head of hogs over the lot & two acres & one half of furniture four
head of young cattle to him his heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Arthur Hart children 200
shillings to be equally divided between them.

Item, I send to my loving wife Martha Hart two negroes Frank
& Ned during of her widowhood & one bay horse five hundred
of cattle one Bed & furniture & two small beds & pyggs.

Item, I leave all the remainder of my estate but it consist
of what it will to be equally divided between my five chil-
dren & loving wife. And I do appoint my son Warren Hart
Henry Hart & Wright Hart my executors of this my last
will & testament as I do sign my hand & seal this 22nd day of
October 1788.

Wright Hart's Will

In the name of God Amen. I Wright Hart of North
Carolina & in Northampton County being in perfect
sense & memory do ordain this my last will & testament
in order as follows to wit

Item, I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Boykin my plantation
I now live on containing six hundred & twenty six acres of
Land seven Negroes, vizt. Anathy, Jerry, Jack, Jude,
Tall Ephraim & Charity and all my stock consisting of cattle
sheep & hogs and all my House hold furniture
and all the rest of my property but it consist of what it will
in doors & out doors to him & his heirs forever
And I do appoint John Boykin & Harting Boykin my Executors
of this my last will & testament
