to my brother Francis Chapple and his heirs forever
I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary Chapple
all the remainder and residue of my estate that is of —

What land and what place should she paying my just
debts and funeral expen- & further my wife and mine
is that my loving wife have the use of the plantation
whereon I now live during her life or widow hood & no longer
Lastly I deem that my Executors may rent out my said
Longwood plantation as they shall think proper
for ye advantage of my said wife Elizabeth
and the profits during of the rent to be applied to her
Maintenance at the discretion of my said Executors
hereafter named

And Lastly I do name and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth
and my brother John Chapple, John Popes & Mrs
Francis Lee & Mrs M^{rs} Williams shall represent to this
my last will & testament disannulling & making void
all other former Wills by me made & this only to be
had taken to be my true last Will
