me with, after my just debts and funeral expenses  
be discharged. Which shall be at the discretion of  
my Executors hereafter named I give and devise in  
the manner following

In witness I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Chappell  
all my lands and plantation lying in this County on  
Roanoke River as well as grounds as the plantation  
wherein I now live they being two hundred acres at the day  
of her entremarriage or the age of twenty one years  
to her & her heirs forever but in case my said —  
Daughter shall die without issue lawfully begotten  
then give in that case I give all the before mentioned land  
to my brother Drury Chappell and his heirs forever  
I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary Chappell  
all the remainder and residue of my estate the sum of  
what kind and what place looks like paying my just  
debts and funeral expenses & further my will and desire  
is that my loving wife have the use of the plantation  
where I now live during her life or widowhood & no longer  
Lastly I desire that my Executor may and set my said  
soil ground & plantation as they shall then propose  
for the advantage of my said wife Elizabeth  
and the just distribution of the rest to be applied to her  
Maintenance at the discretion of my said Executors  
hereafter named

And lastly I do nominate & appoint my loving wife Elizabeth  
and my brother John Chappell John Roper & Mr —  
Drury Lee & Mr William Hall Executors to this  
my last will & testament disannulling & making void  
all other & former Wills by me made & this only to be  
had & taken to be my true last Will  
In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal

The 11 day of November Anno domini 1763 —  
Agreed dated & attested to be This <sup>11th</sup> ~~July~~ <sup>1763</sup> Robert Chappell do seal  
her last will in presence of us Deborah Hester  
Robert Chappell Deborah Hester Marry <sup>month</sup>  
Northampton County p February Court 1764  
the preceding will of Thomas Chappell Esq<sup>r</sup> was admitted  
into Court and pronounced the will of Robert Chappell &  
Thomas Hester two of the Subscribing Witnesses thereto  
at the same time John Roper & Drury Lee were —  
qualified Executors thereto which on the day was agreed  
to be used & executed. Teste I Edward Chappell

#### Henry Cridden Will

In the name of god amen, I Henry Glear being very sick & weak  
to make & contain this my last will & testament in manner following  
Item I give & bequeath unto my living grand son <sup>the</sup> Benjamin Glear  
my Chest & jewels to him & his heirs forever also one Gun barrel.

Item I give & bequeath to my living grandson Frederick Glear all the  
rest of my estate of less paying my debts and to declare that after  
my last will & testament is made & published I have no more  
but my hand & seal the 30<sup>th</sup> day of December 1763.

Subscribing will was admitted into Court & pronounced in the court  
of Henry Cridden one of the Subscribing Witnesses, on motion  
was ordered to be signed & recorded at the same time a power  
granted to Frederick Glear with the will annexed, retaining  
from time to time the same according to Law
