Item I give unto my son John one negro girl called Cal on last furniture the increase of the Negroes to be him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I bind to bear wife as long as she live single.

Item I give to my wife live negroes namely Cal & any other her heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give Margaret unto my three daughters namely Beche Cray Wiscallow. Thomas my son namely Tompy Neash Churn to be equally divided between them to them their heirs & assigns forever.

Item It is my will my wife she have all my household goods to her forever.

And I do appoint my wife & William Deloach whole sole Executors of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have to set my hand & affix my seal this 30<sup>th</sup> Day of April Anno Domini 1782 signed & delivered in presence of

Wm Deloach, Wm Phillips, Samuel Fenell & asad  
Northampton County Sept 1<sup>st</sup> 1782

This will of Samuel Fenell was proved by the oath of Wm Phillips one of the subscribing witnesses. Ann Fenell qualified executrix of the same, ordered to take out probate thereof. Test Jeph Atherton C<sup>l</sup>

### Edward Goodson's Will

In the name of God amen October 21<sup>st</sup> in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty I Edward Goodson of Northampton County in the Province of North Carolina being of sound mind & memory doe make this my last will & Testament first I recommend my soul to almighty God & my body to the earth to be decently buried as touching

my worldly estate I dispose of the same in following manner It is my desire that all my just debts may be paid & settled after my decease by my Executors Hereafter mentioned

Item I give to my son Jeph Goodson the Plantation whereon I now live. Item I give to my daughter Ann Murd five shillings

Item I give to my daughter Cealix Allen five shillings

Item I give to my son Edward Goodson the Plantation whereon I now live to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my loving wife all my moveable Estate Real & Personal to her & her heirs forever.

It is my desire that my wife should be quietly & peaceably possessed with the Plantation & all my Estate whereon I now live forever & not to be interrupted nor disturbed. I do nominate & appoint my loving wife Judith Goodson my whole & sole executrix, Ratifying & Confirming this to be my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand & affix my seal this 30<sup>th</sup> Day of April above written.

In presence of the subscribing witnesses Edward Goodson as a witness, James Vaughan, Thomas Gay, Edward Hillson.

In the name of God amen, I Sarah Gattings of Northampton County State of North Carolina, being at present very sick & weak in body but perfect <sup>sound</sup> mind & memory, thank be to God, therefore <sup>last</sup> willing to make a the last will of my body to constitute & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner following first I Promise & Commit my soul into the hands of God, hoping to have a full pardon of all my sins through the sufferings of my blessed Saviour & inherit everlasting life... as to my body I Commit to the ground from whence it was taken to be buried in a Christian
