In the name of God Amen. I John Bridges of Northampton County
in the Province of North Carolina being very sick & weak but thanks
be to almighty God of sound disposing mind & memory and call-
ing to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life am willing
to make my will first bequeath my soul to almighty God
that gave it me and my body to be decently buried at the
discretion of my executors & trustees of my worldly estate
that hath pleased almighty God to bless me with. I give &
bequeath as followeth that is to say.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Edwin Bridges my plantation
whereon I now live, and all the lands therunto belonging
also the swamp land & purchased of James Bryant, the
Bria Plantation & the lands besides, to him & his heirs forever
only my living wife Faith & his heirs during her widow-
hood, also one feather bed & furniture ten guineas.

Item I give to my son Jonathan Bridges my negro man named
Limer, my negro woman Sharpe, & my negro boy Tony, also
one feather bed & furniture to him this he is to have
forever.

Item I give unto my daughter Sarah Bridges my negro girl
called Rose & her in case one feather bed of furniture
to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Francis Bridges my negro girl
called Book & her in case one feather bed of furniture
to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give unto my living wife Faith Bridges my negro man
named Ned, my negro woman called Betsy, & my negro
woman called Pat they & their in case to her & her
heirs forever, also all the remaining part of my personal estate
not before given & for bringing up my said children, &
their schooling & leave her the labor of my said slaves
that are given to my children till the arrival of a promissory
note or memorandum & appoint my living wife Faith Bridges
my executrix. Wm Ruffin & Gran Hill, executors to
my will. I now to ge
In my last will, I stellament, reciting & disannulling

all former wills by me made, & this to be my last, I do
this day whereof I do in this manner set my hand & sign my seal
the fourteenth day of September, one thousand seven hun-
dred and forty three.

Francis Graces Will

In the name of God Amen. I Francis Graces of Northampton County in the Province
of North Carolina being sick & weak of body but of perfect sound memory do
make this my last will & testament in manner & form following.
Item my will is that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid after
which the remainder of what estate I both have & the almighty God
to bestow upon me I dispose of in the following manner.

Item I leave to my living wife Mary Graces the use of my whole estate
during her widow hood, and if my said wife should marry
then immediately after which my desire is that my whole
estate should be equally divided between my wife & my said
son, upchich said proportion of my estate I give to my wife
otherwise to be distributed.

Lastly I do nominate & appoint my living wife executrix of this my last
will, trusting whereof I have set my hand and affixing seal this
twenty seventh day of October anno domini 1763.

Rachel Bridges Will

In the name of God Amen. The second day of May in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & forty four. I Rachel Bridges of Northampton County & Province of North Carolina, being both in body bust & sound & perfect sense & memory thank be to almighty God for the same am calling to mind that it is appointed for all men to die. I do hereby make & ordain this my last will & Testament hereby recommending of my soul into the hands of my neighbour to do with it as he sees fit & my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors herein after named. And as touching of my worldly estate wherewith it has been pleased God to bless me with the same I give & dispose of the same in the following manner.

Item I give unto Biguath unto my son William Bridges my negro man named Jack & his band shall be him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give unto Biguath unto my son John Bridges my negro woman named Rose. She is now free from this time to him her heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give unto Biguath unto my son William Bridges my negro man & his band to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give unto Biguath unto my daughter Elizabeth my gray mare the colt & my side saddle & Bridle & my large Chest & my new linnen sheet & my Hatchet & my iron black nut Table & two west Lamb's and small trunk to her & her heirs & assigns forever.

Item all the rest of my estate of whatsoever kind that is not here in my will before given away I give dec'd Biguath unto my two daughters Patience & Temperance to be equally divided between them, to them their heirs & assigns forever.

I do hereby constitute & appoint William Ruffin & John Duke & Richard Neal my whole executors of this my last will and testament hereby making null & void all former wills & testaments by me made or done in this my last will & testament.
