Edmund Griffin Will

In the name of God amen, I Edmund Griffin of the County
of Northampton in the Province of North Carolina, being of
sound mind & memory do make & ordain this my last will &
testament. First I recommend my soul to Almighty God
in hope of its future happiness, & my body to the Earth to be
sently buried, my worthy good & neighbour in manner
& form following.

I give Bequeath unto my dear beloved wife Martha Griffin
one negro wench old hatty, one horse named Slaney &
four Cows & calves, four Saws & Rigs, two Shovels & other onboard.

Six plates & six Spoons, one black walnut table, one chest six
Chairs, one bed of garniture, one Iron Pot & Kack, one Plan &
three Sheps, forty barrels of Corn at the fall, & ten bushells of wheat
Six Pounds Prog money, I take it to be my intent two negroes
Dick & Harry & the land I bought of Adam Elcock During
life, then the above land to be sold & the money there arising to
be equally divided among my four sons or their survivors.

I will attorney command that my negro shall be worked on my
Plantation, under the direction of my executors, until the Crop is
finished. Then the land wherein I now live to be sold to the highest
Bidder, giving twelve months Credit, and the money there arising
to be equally divided among my four sons or their survivors.
Then my negroes to be held at the direction of my executors to educate
support my children. & my will is that of either of my Chil-
dren married or comes to age that there shall be an equal
Division of my negroes among my children.

3rd My will & desire is after my debts of funeral expenses are paid
plus with the legacy above bequeathed, that what ever
ready money I may be possessed with, also my out stand-
ing Debts, amounts Bills Notes or Bonds with all the
rest of my Estate not before given to be sold by my
executors to be equally divided among my children.

4th My will & desire is that my sons be bound out at the direction
of my executors.

5th My will & desire is that my son be satisfied for his trouble at
the direction of every Orphan Court.

I do hereby nominate & appoint my friend James Dancy executor
of this my last will & testament, ratifying & confirming
this to be my last will & testament. Signed with my hand
Sealed with my seal this 20 day of April one thousand
seven hundred twenty one. ^{his} Edmund Griffin & seal

John Griggs Will

In the name of God amen. I John Griggs of Northampton County being sick & weak, but of sound mind & memory & understanding. Thinketh before me the same, & calling to mind the changes & chances of this transitory life, thinawing the certainty of death, & the uncertainty of the time thereof. Do make & ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following next that is to say first principally, I give my soul to almighty God that gave it me, & my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors to Name. In witness. It is my will & desire that all my just debts & funeral expenses be discharged.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary McDavid one hundred Acres of land, the upper part of my land down to the dividing line more or less, so her she heirs lawfully begotten of his boy or girls.

Item I give & bequeath to my feather bed furniture two Cows & Calves, two year old mares, 2 Sows & pigs, one young mare, one chest, one pot to my daughter Mary McDavid to her heirs lawfully begotten of her Body & assigns.

Item I give ^{my} to my son William Griggs the plantation I now have in, & all the remaining part of my land to him & his heirs or assigns forever.

Item It is my will & desire that all the remaining part of my estate of what nature soever, that is not given in ^{my} will to be equally divided between my loving wife Mary Griggs & my son William Griggs without settling the same.

Item It is my will & desire that if either my son William Griggs or my daughter Mary McDavid die without Heir, that the land I give them should return to the other, & in case they both die without heir then it is will & desire that the said land should fall to my grand son John Griggs, son of Joshua Griggs.

Item I appoint my living wife Mary Griggs & my son William Griggs each of them my last will & testam. to revoke & annul all former wills by me made, ratifying & confirming this & only this to be my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 11th day of Febry 1767.

Oscar Jordan's Will

In the name of God amen. I Oscar Jordan being thos the abundant mercy & goodness of God, the weak in body yet of a sound perfect understand & memory do constitute this my last will & testament & desire it may be received by all as such. Impressing most humbly begotten my soul to God my maker. In witness I give my body to the earth, from whence it was taken in full assurance of its Resurrection from thence at the last day, as to my dear body estate I order that all my debts of funeral charges be paid & then & issue of it in manner following.

Item I give unto my living wife along the plantation I now have one dozen negroes namely, Lee, Cain, Phillip & Hannah, also three feather beds & 12 head of cattle & six head of sheep, and all my Hogs, two horses & one Cow & 2 Spining Wheels, 2 Tables, 1 dog setting chairs, 1/2 Doz dishes, 4 Barns, 2 Dog plates, 63 pots 2 frying pans & 2 Hair combs, & Jack Conynges belonging to me, during her widow hood, & after her decease or marriage, I desire may be an equal division of those negroes & the increase of them & all the manna blis of those above mentioned. Household Goods & stock among all my children namely, Mrs Jordan Lucy, Jordan Marinda, the Indian, Owners, Jordan, River, Jordan, Thomas Jordan & them that my wife is with Child with.
