upper part of my Land, fronting just Churah Path.
- Item I give & bequeath unto my son Samuel Rawell the Churah my  
Plantation & the remainder of my land.
- Item I give & bequeath to my son Robert Rawell twenty five Millings
- Item I give & bequeath unto my son Simon Rawell twenty five Millings
- Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Martha Rawell twenty Millings
- Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Rawell twenty Millings
- Item I give & bequeath unto my wife wife Lucy Rawell the use of all the  
rest of my estate during her life & should she die to be equally divided  
between my daughters Martha Rawell & my daughter Margaret  
Rawell and my son Robert Rawell my son and me Rawell,  
I likewise <sup>constitute</sup> & appoint my son Edward Rawell my sole  
executer & do hereby revoke & annul all my former  
testament named will & bequeath & relying & confirming  
there neither take my last will & testament. Made up <sup>on</sup> the 1st  
January last set my hand & seal the day & year above written 1766

### James Hall Will

- In the Name of God Amen. James Hall of the County of Amelia  
being infirm & health & of sound mind & memory, thanks be to god  
for the same, but knowing the uncertainty of life do make  
this my last will & Testament in manner & form as follows.
- First I give my soul to god who gave it me, & my body to be buried at  
the discretion of my executors hereafter named.
- Item I give & bequeath to my son James Hall & his heirs & assigns  
fifteen two hundred acres of land which does include the Plan-  
tation he now lives on with one negro woman named Phil & all  
her increase, except one negro girl I have already given  
with her increase to my daughter Ruth.
- Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Francis & her Heirs & assigns  
fifteen one negro girl named Dolly with her increase & one  
side saddle & feather bed & bedding & candle sticks with all other  
furniture &c.
- Item My will is in my desire affixed to have the whole use of  
my Carolina Plantation bought formerly of Mr. John Hobbs & three  
hundred acres of land adjoining thereto, as also his Chipping tree  
of my best Negro as also what house hold goods she might  
please to take, such as bed furniture & clothes & any other  
things there in what stock of cattle horses mares sheep & pigs  
all her during during her natural life and at her decease  
my desire is that I have left my wife should be equally provided be-  
tween my three Servants, Theodore, William & Benjamin  
for none of my other children to come in for any part left  
my wife, but to be given to Theodore, William, & Benjamin  
to them & their heirs & assigns forever.
- Item My will is that all my land & plantation I have live or be  
left the money appropriated to the payment of my last will & testa-  
ment.
- Item My will is that all my Negroes & my other estate not already  
mention'd be equally divided between my three Sons, Theodore  
and William & Benjamin to them & their heirs & assigns forever.
- Item Please my dear beloved wife & my son James Hall my whole  
executors of this my last will & testament as setting my hand

Deed x. 155 of December 11. 1766 & 1755.

*James Hilliard Will*

In the name of god ame. James Hilliard of the Province of North  
Carolina & County of New Hanpford, thanks be to almighty god,  
bring in a bad state of health but of sound mind & disposing man  
ey & calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life do make  
ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following. In p's  
just & bequeath my soul to almighty god that gave it me & my  
body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors my  
worldly estate I give & bequeath as followeth.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Lawrence Hilliard the  
Plantation whereon I now dwelle. Containing two hundred  
acres with all the appurtenances thereto belonging my Plantation  
known by the name of the hog pen neck. Containing four  
hundred acres, by the same more or less, and also my Plantation  
whereon my mother now dwelle containing one hundred  
acres by bequeath to my son Richard Hilliard, also three  
hundred acres of woodland joining the last mentioned  
Plantation otherwise my Plantation that formerly belonged  
to Richard Hilliard containing one hundred fifty acres had  
purchased of my brother William Hilliard to him his heirs  
& assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Lawrence Hilliard  
of new  
a Plantation lying being in the Province of South Carolina  
in the aforesaid State, that my brother William Hilliard,

purchased of Anna Margrith <sup>b't</sup> containing two hundred acres of land  
be the same more or less otherwise had plantation of mine containing  
one hundred fifty acres of land more or less that my brother  
William Hilliard purchased of Barnaby Pope & realestate or  
Parcel of Land that I purchased myself of William Scott gain-  
ing the said last mentioned plantation containing forty one  
Acres more or less to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item Meal my will & desire is that if my son William Lawrence Hill-  
iard die without issue before he shall arrive the at  
full & lawful age of twenty one years, that then I give & bequeath  
unto my Brother Elias Hilliard the plantation wherein I  
now live & also the said plantation known by the name of the  
Hogpen neck containing four hundred acres more or less  
to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto William Roach that plantation of mine lying  
in the Province of South Carolina on the aforesaid River joining of old  
William Hunter's land containing three hundred acres, in the same more  
or less it to him his heirs & assigns forever. And this is that the  
said William Roach die before he arrives at the full & lawful years  
of age of twenty one or without issue, that then I give & bequeath the  
said plantation three hundred acres of land more or less unto my  
son William Lawrence Hilliard his heirs & assigns forever.  
Likewise my will & desire is that if my son William Lawrence Hilliard  
die without issue before he shall arrive at the full & lawful  
age of twenty one that then I give & bequeath the said plantation that he  
formerly belonged to Richard Hilliard that I purchased of my brother  
William Hilliard containing one hundred fifty acres more  
or less to my brother Elias Hilliard his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Lawrence Hilliard my negro  
fellow called Dick & Mingo Peter, Tom, old Cal Sampson & London  
also my negro w'mches Hager, Judah, Amos, Job, & Dall  
& their Inhabitants also my negro boys Bot & Minct.

Item my will & desire is that my mother Anna Hilliard should have  
the labor & profits of the following negroes to her, Daniel  
Lucy & Pig & the young Child of Lucy during her natural life
