Moses Hall's Will

Northampton County 3rd Decr known unto all men
North Carolina by these presents that I now
have being sick very weak of body but in perfect
strength of mind & memory do make & ordain this
my last will & testament that is to say, Principal
ly first of all I commend my soul into the hands
of God that gave it, my body I commit to the earth
to be decently buried at the discretion of my execu-
tors hereafter named & as touching such worldly
estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless
me with in this life I give & devise & dispose of
the same in the following manner & form,

first I will that all my just debts as I do owe in right or
Concerner to any person whatsoever be well & truly paid,
ordained to be paid in convenient time after my
death by my Executrix hereafter named.

Item I give to my dear wife the sole benefit of my plantation during her natural life or widowhood, and after her decease or marriage, I give said plantation to my son Moses Hall, I give to my son Moses Hall one Calf
Item I give to my wife one feather bed of moderate bigness belonging of four Cows & Calves, two large hewer bars one large Sides one Dozen of water plates half a dozen Earthen plates four large milk pans.

Item I give to my son Moses Hall one fair year old Steer one
three year old heifer, one broad Ax one mow now axed.

Item I give to my son Isaac Hall one feather bed of moderate bigness, long copper tools except iron drawing tools.

Item I give to my son Joseph Hall one feather bed of moderate bigness belonging one Cow & calf, two year old Steer two year old heifer.

Item I give to my daughter Anne one feather bed of moderate bigness and
my riding horse & one woman saddle,

Item I give to my daughter Sarah Hall one feather bed of moderate bigness & two Cows & calves,

Item I nominate and appoint John & his Robert Miller executors of this my last will & testament and I do by these present
utterly disallow, revoke & annul all & every other
will & testament, legacies & bequests by me before
this time named made or bequeathed Ratifying &
Confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand on this 2^d
day of the 10th month Called October 1762

Item I give & bequeath unto John Hawe all the rest of my moveable estate
of whatsoever kind it may consist to be sold for money and
her kept for the said John Hawe in the hands of my execu
tor aforesaid, until the said John Hawe shall be living
one year of age, & then my daughter to account with him for
yelam & incase my son John Hawe ^{be born} die before his arriv
ing to full twenty years of age, then all his property of estate
to fully & absolutely to fail to my daughter Mannas Hawe,
