 North Carolina } by these presents that I Moses
 Hall being sick very weak of body, but in perfect
 strength of mind & memory, do make & ordain this
 my last will & testament that is to say, I principally
 first of all I give commend my soul into the hands
 of God that gave it, my body I commit to the earth
 to be decently buried at the discretion of my execu-
 tors hereafter named & as touching such world-
 ly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless

Item I give to my son Isaac Hall one feather bed of furniture
 thereto belonging, Long Caspers tools except one drawing knife.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Joseph Hall one feather bed of furniture
 therunto belonging one Cow & calf, one year old steer two year old heifer.

Item I give to my daughter Anne one feather bed of furniture and
 my riding horse & one or more saddles.

Item I give to my daughter Sarah Hall one feather bed of furniture
 & two Cows & calves.

Item I nominate and appoint John & Robert Puller Execu-
 tors of this my last will & testament. And I do by these presents
 utterly disallow, revoke & annul all & every other

- Item I give & bequeath to my son Frederick Howells of Plantations wherein I now live with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging to him his heirs & assigns forever
