Hart Arthur Will

In the name of God amen. I Arthur Hart of North Carolina
& in Northampton County being in perfect sense & memory do
ordain this my last will & testament in order & manner
as follows to wit

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Warren Hart the plantation
he now lives on and two negroes James & Charity to him
his heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Henry Hart the plantation
he now lives on & two negroes Eliza & Frank to him his
heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Wright Hart the plantation
I now live on containing 476 acres of our negroes Doubly
Jerry, Jacob Ephraim & Chancy two cows & calves
clams & white man the married & twelve head of hogs
& one feather Bed & furniture to him his heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath unto my son Robert Hart five
negroes, Leazar, Anthony, Adia, Jack & Willy to him his
heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Isham Hart all my piney
wood land on the north side of Goosehawk Craggy, Philles
Tally, Sude & Adams two bag fillings four hundred
head of hogs over the lot & two acres & one half of furniture four
head of young cattle to him his heirs forever.

Item, I give & bequeath to my son Arthur Hart children 20
shilling to be equally divided between them.

Item, I send to my loving wife Martha Hart two negroes Frank
& Ned during of her widowhood & one bay horse five hundred
of cattle one bed & furniture & two small beds & pyggs.

Item, I leave all the remainder of my estate but it consist
of what it will to be equally divided between my five chil
dren & loving wife. And I do appoint my son Warren Hart
Henry Hart & Wright Hart my executors of this my last
will & testament as I do sign my hand & seal this 22nd day of
October 1788.

Wright Hart's Will

In the name of God Amen. I Wright Hart of North
Carolina & in Northampton County being in perfect
sense & memory do ordain this my last will & testament
in order as follows to wit

Item, I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Boykin my plantation
I now live on containing six hundred & twenty six acres of
Land seven negroes, vizt. Anathy, Jerry, Jack, Jude,
Tall Ephraim & Chancy and all my stock consisting of three
cattle sheep & hogs and all my house hold furniture
and all the rest of my property but it consist of what it will
in doors & out doors to him & his heirs forever
And I do appoint John Boykin & Harting Boykin my Executors
of this my last will & testament

1789

Joseph Moody's Will

In the name of God Amen, I Joseph Moody of the parish of North Carolina in Northampton County & last parish being weak of body but of sound mind & memory thank be unto God for the same & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye & being blessed with a small portion of this worldly goods do make & ordain my last will & Testament in manner following, First I give or commend my soul to God who gave it, trusting in the merits of my blessed Lord & saviour for the remission of all my sins & my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors herein after named, and as touching my worldly estate I give & dispose of the same as followeth,

Item I give & bequeath to my son Henry Moody the sum of five Shillings prock money, to him this heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Benjamin Moody the sum of five Shillings prock money to him this heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my son Samuel Moody the sum of five Shillings prock money to him this heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Lydia Morris ⁴⁷⁶ wife of William Morris the sum of five Shillings prock money to her this heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Morley the a sum of five Shillings the sum of five Shillings prock money to her this heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah Smith wife of Benjamin Smith the sum of five Shillings prock money to her & her heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah Rock the wife of John Rock the sum of five Shillings prock money & also at my decease the land I lay on with all the furniture belonging to it to her & her heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my living son Winchell Gillingham all the land & plantation whereon I now live with the appurtenances also my negro picture Dick and eight my slaves discharged all the rest of my worldly estate I bequeath to my son Winchell Gillingham all only to him this heirs forever

Item I give my son Winchell Gillingham whole and sole executor of this my last will and Testament, him and my hand sealed this 30th day of October 1778.
