It is also my will that the negroes, Old Sam Robin Pompey Rodpink & Ade Kate & Ben Small Children, that is fallen to let out, shall be kept & work on my plantation but let out until my Son John Neal comes to the age of twenty one year, then it is my will that the whole of my negroes & all the remainder of my Estate be equally divided between my two sons & I hereby constitute & ordain my loving friend, John Knox & Thomas White of the County aforesaid to be my last will & Testament & to hereby execute & make void all & every other former Testaments, Wills & bequests by me made Ratifying this & no other to be my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year before sh^{en} written

Mary Heath of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina being very sick at present but of perfect sound mind & memory thanks be to God therefor but feeling to mind the mortality of the Body both given & dispose of my Goods & Chattels in the manner & form following

I^{tem} I give the fourth to Daughter Nancy Dawson Barnes one fourth the best & furniture one fourth & leaving my great part to her has heirs forever.

I^{tem} I give the fourth unto my son John Dawson Harris my Col^l & that

now I wish the more of all my part of my father's Estate that I have not Rec^d to him this heirs forever.

I^{tem} I give the fourth to my daughter Elizabeth Harris one fourth the best & furniture one fourth & leaving my great part to her has heirs forever.

And my desire is that my negroes Jacob & Sybil & all other children be sold & the money arising from their sale shall be put to the use of Raising my two small Children, William Hart & Edmund Hart until they come to the age of fifteen years old & my desire is that at the end of the above fifteen years that all my negroes shall be equally divided between my three youngest Children, Elizabeth Harris, William Hart & Edmund Hart to them their heirs forever & my desire is that if either of my three youngest Children shall die before they come of age that their part of my Estate shall be divided between the other two. And my desire is that the remainder of my Estate may be sold to pay my debts & the remainder of the money of the debts shall be equally divided between my three Children Elizabeth Harris, William Hart & Edmund Hart to them their heirs forever.

And I do constitute & appoint Henry Smith & Balow Barnes my whole sole Executors of this my last will & Testament & in making & making void all other wills heretofore by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23^d day of October 1781. Mary^h Hart Casual
