James Hilliard, Jr. Will

In the name of god amen. James Hilliard of the Province of North
Carolina County of New Hampton, thanks be to almighty god,
bring in a bad state of Health but of sound mind & disposing me
of my calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life do make
and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following vizt;
first I bequeath my soul to almighty god that gave it me & my
body to be decently buried at the direction of my executors my
worldly estate to you & bequeath as followeth.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Lawrence Hilliard the
Plantation whereon I now dwelt. Containing two hundred
acres with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging my Plantation
known by the name of the Hogpen neck. Containing four
hundred acres in the same more or less, and also my Plantation
wherein my mother now dwelt containing one hundred
acres by a bequeath to mein my Father will also three
hundred acres of woodland joining the last mentioned
Plantation likewise my Plantation that formerly belonged
to Richard Wills containing one hundred fifty acres both
purchased of my brother William Hilliard to him his heirs
& assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Lawrence Hilliard
my Plantation ^{of mine} being there in the Province of South Carolina
in the aforesaid Street that my brother William Hilliard.

purchased of James Meigh Containing two hundred acres of land
be the same more or less likewise had Plantation of mine Contain-
ing one hundred fifty acres of land more or less that my brother
William Hilliard purchased of Barnaby Pope & also a tract or
Parcel of Land that I purchased myself of William Scott go-
ing the said last mentioned Plantation Containing sev'one
acres more or less to him the heirs & assigns forever.

Item Now my will & desire is that of my son William Lawrence Hilliard
be it so without you before he shall arrive the at-
full & lawfull age of twenty one years, that then I give & bequeath
unto my Brother Elias Hilliard the Plantation aforesaid
now live & also the said Plantation known by the name of the
Hogpen neck Containing four hundred acres more or less
to him the heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto William Roach that Plantation of mine lying
in the Province of South Carolina on the aforesaid River joining of old
William Hunter's land. Containing three hundred acres in the same more
or less it being to whom the heirs & assigns forever. And also is half the
said William Roach death before he arrives at the full & lawfull years
of age of twenty one or without you, that then I give & bequeath the
said Plantation three hundred acres of land more or less unto my
son William Lawrence Hilliard his heirs & assigns forever.
Likewise my will & desire is that of my son William Lawrence Hilliard
death without you before he shall arrive at the full & lawfull
age of twenty one that then I bequeath the said Plantation that he
formerly belonged to Richard Wills that I purchased of my Brother
William Hilliard Containing one hundred fifty acres more
or less to my Brother Elias Hilliard his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Lawrence Hilliard my negro
servants called Dick & Mingo Peter Tom, old Calo Sampson & London
also my Negro wench Hager, Indeckhamer, Sakeah & Dall
& their spouses & also my negro boys Kest & Mingo.

Item my will & desire is that my mother Anne Hilliard should have
the labor & profits of the following negroes to her, Sam'l
Lucy & Pig & the young Child of Lucy during her natural life

After her death I give & bequeath to said negroes to my Son William Lawrence Hilliard & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath my said riding horse unto my Sister Anne Hilliard & her heirs & assigns.

Item My will & desire is that if my Son William Lawrence Hilliard die before he is of lawful age or without issue, that after my just debts, expenses & all my negroes & their increase be equally divided between my two Brothers Isaac Hilliard & Elias Hilliard & my Sister Anne Hilliard.

Item I give & bequeath & my desire is to give to William Roach power, directing maintaining of him the sum of twenty seven pounds proclamation money & have my will desire is that if any debts should be against my Estate more than my Stock of Hogs & Cattle such as will be sold at the discretion of my executors my Vendable Estate will be able to discharge that then my will & desire is that the three following negroes viz Andrew, Jordan & Kate that were before given & bequeath ed to my Son William Lawrence Hilliard be sold to discharge the same.

and I do hereby nominate & appoint Osborne Jeffers Henry Dawson executors of this my last will & Testament & do renounce & make void all former wills by me made & other I have to be my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twelfth day of February one thousand seven hundred forty four. signed sealed interlined before me and witnessed the tenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred forty five. for it is known unto all men by these presents that James Hilliard of North Carolina
of Washington County, have made & sealed my last will
testament in writing bearing date the twelfth day of February
one thousand seven hundred forty four. I the said James Hilliard
do by this presents Codicil Confirm & Ratify my said last will

& testament & do give & bequeath unto my Brother Isaac Hilliard & his heirs lying in Suffolk Park in Edgecombe County known by the name of Griffis Plantation Containing four hundred & forty acres of land & 100 slaves to him his heirs forever. Also my Plantation containing six hundred & forty acres lying on Hilliards Big Basket to him this his son. I give & bequeath unto my Brother Elias Hilliard five hundred and twelve acres of land & 100 slaves of mine joining the said Elias Hilliards Plantation & Phillip Quinbourne lie the same more or less to him his heirs & assigns forever. And I do hereby nominate & appoint my Brother Isaac Hilliard & his wife the aforesaid Osborne Jeffers & Henry Dawson
and my will & meaning is that this Codicil or Sub-Codice be added & judged to be part & parcel of my said last will & Testament & that all things herein contained & intended be faithfully & truly performed & as fully and amply in every respect as if the same were to be read & set down in my said last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the twenty first day of February one thousand seven hundred forty four.
