In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Hallawell of Northampton County & Province of North Carolina being sick weak in body but of perfect sound memory, & being to mind the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death have thought it expedient to settle my worldly business in manner & form following in the first place I fully give up my soul to God that gave it. Secondly to have my body decently entred of my wife & family my will & desire is that all my just debts be honestly & religiously settled - and more as touching this worldly goods which it hath pleased God to bless me with I have disposed of in manner & form following. Viz.

Item I leave all my Land & Plantations which I purchased of Joseph Jordan & where our family live, to be sold to pay my debts & if any surplus from the sale thereof to be divided as hereafter

mentioned. In case the said should not sell for enough then some other part of my Estate that may be thought of least hurt to my Children.

Item I give to my son Sylas Hallawell five shillings Sterling.

Item I give & bequeath to my wife Leah Hallawell the use of all my Land & Mill on Kirbys Creek & my negro man Jonas. So much of the profits therefrom arising as will support my wife & the said Jonas & my sons Joseph & Thomas Hallawell until the above mentioned Children shall come to the age of twenty one years, & all the surplus to be divided when my son Thomas Hallawell shall come of age, to be equally divided between my two sons Joseph & Thomas Hallawell.

Item I give & bequeath all the above mentioned Land & Mill lying on Kirbys Creek to my two sons Joseph & Thomas Hallawell to be equally divided between them & their heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Joseph Hallawell my negro man named Jonas to him his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Hallawell one whipsaw, one Hand Mill & one black walnut Desk to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my three daughters Esther, Sarah & Christina Hallawell my negro man Gideon to them & their heirs forever.

Item In case my two sons Joseph & Thomas Hallawell should die without issue then the above mentioned Mill & Land & the rest of their Estates to fall to an equal Division between my three above mentioned Daughters but not until my wife's death.

Item I give unto my wife Leah Hallawell one mare called Domino & all the Estate or Savings that she will possess of her former husband's Trunk & more to her & her disposal.

Item I give all the rest of my Estate wherever to be paid to be equally divided between my five Children Esther, Sarah, Christina, Joseph & Thomas Hallawell equally & forever.

In the first place I fully give up my soul to God that gave it. Secondly to have my body decently entred of my wife Thirdly my will & desire is that all my just debts be honestly & faithfully settled - and now as touching this worldly goods which it hath been pleased God to bless me with I have this part of in manner & form following. Viz.

Item I have all my Land Plantations which I purchased of Joseph Jordan & where now I now live, to be sold to pay my debts & if any surplus from the sale thereof to be divided as hereafter

mentioned. In case the said should not sell for enough then some other part of my Estate that may be thought of least best to my Children.

- Item I Give to my son Syllas Hallawell five shillings Sterling.
- Item I Give & bequeath to my wife Leah Hallawell the use of all my Land & Mill on Kings Creek & my negro man Jonas, so much of the profits therefrom arising as will support my wife & the said Jonas & my sons Joseph & Thomas Hallawell until the above mentioned Children shall come to the age of twenty one years, & all the surplus to be divided when my son Thomas Hallawell shall come of age, to be equally divided between my two sons Joseph & Thomas Hallawell.
- Item I Give & bequeath all the above mentioned Land & Mill lying on Kings Creek to my two sons Joseph & Thomas Hallawell to be equally divided between them & their heirs forever.
- Item I Give & bequeath to my son Joseph Hallawell my negro man named Jonas to him his heirs forever.
- Item I Give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Hallawell one whip saw, one Hand Mill & one black walnut Dick to him & his heirs forever.
- Item I Give & bequeath to my three daughters Esther, Sarah, & Christina Hallawell my negro man Gideon to them & their heirs forever.
- Item In case my two sons Joseph & Thomas Hallawell should die without issue then the above mentioned Mill & Land & the rest of their Estates to fall to an Equal Division between my three above mentioned Daughters but not until my wife's death.
- Item I Give unto my wife Leah Hallawell one more callow Simmer & all the Estate & Dower that she did possess of her former husband Truman Moon to her the disposal.
- Item I Give all the rest of my Estate wherever to be paid to be equally divided between my four Children Esther, Sarah, Christina, Joseph & Thomas Hallawell equally between them.

And Lastly I nominate & appoint my wife Leah Hallawell
and my two daughters Esther & Sarah Hallawell my sole
Executors to this my last will & Testament, revoking
& making void all wills by me made heretofore.
Ratifying this to be my last will & Testament & No other
this twenty third day of January in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred & twenty eight.

Wichland Washington will

In the name of God Amen. I Wichland Washington of North-
ampton County Province of North Carolina, being very sick
& weak in body, but in my perfect senses & memory, do wish
be good for it, & Calling to mind the mortality of my body, &
knowing that it is ordained for all men to die, do make
Constitute & Ordain this my last will & Testament, becom-
ing & revoking all other wills & wills whatsoever heretofore
made by me.

I bequeath my soul to God that gave it me, relying
on the merits of my blessed Saviour to have full remission
of all my sins, & my body to the earth to be buried at the
discretion of my Executors hereafter named.

I give & bequeath unto my Brother John Washington that
part of my land (that is where now I now live) joining Turkey
Creek, that is from where it joins the said River Washington
River on the said Creek, then up the said Creek to where it
strikes Richard Andrews line, then along the said Andrews
line until it crosses the left prong of his mill servants,

then up said prong or branch until it strikes the Country
road, then (cross the said road, until it comes to the
said John Washingtons land, and I like order give him all
Sable Deer & Demands due from him to me, and I assign
him the Cows that are bought of the Estate.

I give & bequeath to my Brother Nicholas Washington the re-
maining part of the said tract of land, and one Negro
fellow named Lewis, on condition that he the said Nicholas
Washington pay unto his mother Joyce Washington yearly
four hundred weight of merchantable Pork as long as
his said mother shall live, without the said Negro except
then he is exempted from the said payments, & I give him my
wearing Broad Cloth Coat, & half my Shirts & the other half
I give to John Washington.

I give & bequeath unto my Sister Joyce Washington one Negro
fellow called Charles on condition that she pay unto her
Mother Joyce Washington two hundred weight of Good
merchantable Pork yearly as long as her said Mother
shall live, without the said Negro shall die first, then
she is exempt from the said payments.

I give & bequeath unto my Sister Elizabeth Washington two
ty bound Virginia Money & my Riding horse, on provision that
she pay unto my Executors four Pound Virginia Currency.

I give & bequeath unto my Brother Robert Washington my
Silver watch which is now at the John Smiths, of Sayre
Halifax on provision that he pay for the mending the said watch
& my Sustain.

I give & bequeath unto my Brother Benjamin Washington my
Coat the same at Sayre Warrants she is to pay for the making
the same, and my blue broad cloth Jacket & likewise give
him his Note of hand that I have of him and all other debts due
from him to me.

I give & bequeath unto my Sister Joanna Thompson one
feather bed after the death of her mother.

I give & bequeath unto James Denton of the said County five Pound
Virginia Money.
