Richard Hyde Will

In the name of god amen, I Richard Hyde of Wrentham County calling to mind the mortality of my body that it is appained for all men once to die do here make my last will & testament in manner & form following.
 Impriest I give & bequeath to my son Henry Hyde my tract of land in Northampton County lying in Cedar run containing thereon ^{to} acres to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Lucas Hyde two hundred & ten acres of land lying in Brimfield County in the middle of Fish Creek, adjoining James Williams & David Hyde & James Williams to lay of begining where my said brother James Crooper the Coblin branch of same shew to the upper line directly to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my wife Mildred Hyde three negroes to wit, Jacob Tolly, Burmester during her widow hood sat her marriage I death I give my negro man named Jacob to my son Henry Hyde my negro woman named Isaac & man named Tolly I give to my son Lucas

Hyde but in case either of my said sons die without their lawfully begotten that this part or portion ^{there} equally divided between my other two sons, viz, the survivors of the above said sons & my son Hartwell Hyde.

Item My wife being now with child if it please god she be safely delivered of it I give the first child that my negro Wench Burmester shall bear alive in the time of my wife's widowhood to the child that my wife is now bigg with.

Item I also bind to my wife all my Stock of cattle, sheep & goethers except my grey horse called Sampson during her widowhood, also I bind to my said wife my household goods during her widowhood except my four feather beds & furniture.

Item I give to my three sons to wit, Henry Hyde, Hartwell Hyde, Lazarus Hyde, one feather bed of furniture apiece.

Item I also give to my wife Mildred Hyde one feather bed of furniture.

Item I give to my Daughter Anne Arent my grey horse called Sampson.

Item my will is that at the marriage or death of my said wife that all the remainder of my Stock, household goods to be sold at public sale and equally divided among my three sons (viz) Henry Hyde, Lazarus Hyde, Hartwell Hyde, & the child that my wife is now bigg with.

Item I give to my daughter Leticia Hyde one negroe girl named Lucy to her she heirs forever.

Item I give to daughter Sophia Hyde one negroe boy named Gallas to her she heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Lucy Hyde one negroe boy named Moody to her she heirs forever.

But if either of my said daughters dies without her lawfully begotten my desire is that their part I have left in die between the survivors of them,

Impriest I give to my son Hartwell Hyde my plantation wherein I saw her and all my other lands which I have not disposed of to him & his heirs forever I also give to my son Hartwell Hyde one negroe wench named Curander after the marriage or death of my wife.

2 Items I give to my wife that money that is due to me from her
Mothers Estate. Also his money Crop of tobacco & outstanding
debts to discharge my Just debts & providing necessaries for
my family.

And I certify & appoint my wife, Mildred Hyde & Hartigell Burt
executrix of this my last will & testament abrogating all
former wills by me made. I acknowledge this only to be my
last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal the fifteenth day may A.D. 1762.

In the name of God Amen. The twenty third day of April
in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred
and thirty three, I William Bridges of Northampton County
in the province of North Carolina being sick in body but of
sound & perfect mind & memory thank God & Calling
to mind that it is appointed for all men to die, do make
and ordain this my last will & Testament hereby renouncing
my soul unto the hands of my redeemer & my body
to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereinafter
named, And as touching my worldly Estate wherewith
it has pleased almighty God to bless me in this life
I dispose of the same in the following manner to wit
My will & desire that my beloved wife Rachel Bridges
do have the use & benefit of my plantation & the land there
unto belonging during her widowhood.

I give you also my plantation & all the slaves belonging thereto, which the mother has the use of during her life or so long as she shall be a widow to him & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten of his body forever.

Item I give cedar shingematch unto my son Mr. Bridges our father
his furniture & my sword. Make my own using gun &
my saddle & bridle to him & his heirs forever.

I give desire Huguenot with my son John Bridges my Plan
talion & land that I purchased of Mrs Daughtry also all my
land that I purchased of Mr Green Hill, wif Henry Woods
& one feather bed & furniture. I my young grey horse Saddle bronc
& my gun that was Henry Daughtry's & fifteen pounds weight
Carriag in the glazed colors come to live at home.

Item I give again Shugnath unto my son Hobo & I give all the
land that purchased of John Reddick & am f. after his & given
to my young dark boy named Long gun that when he comes
up fifteen pounds Virgin Currency, in the gold & silver Coin to
him & his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give during & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth my negro
girl named India & her increase, one feather bed of furniture
& ten pounds weight of Cambray in Gold & Silver Coin to last
to her heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give Abigail unto my daughter Patience my negro girl
named Hannah & her increase & one feather bed & furniture
of ten pounds weight. Community in the gold & silver coin to
her & her heirs & assigns forever.

Now I give down Abigail with my Daughter Temperance
my only girl named ^{for} ~~Martha~~ Temperance your feather bed &
furniture ten pounds ~~Very~~ money in the gold & silver
Cain to her & her heirs & signs forever

Item This my will desire that all the Segars heretofore in my
will given away to be made good out of my Estate
that the residue I give down they may cut into my will
be used wife Rachel Bridges for her to maintain and
