In the name of God amen I John Hayes of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina being very sick & weak but in perfect sound body & memory but calling to mind that all men must die I make this my last will & testament In the manner & form as followeth I recommend my soul to God that gave it & my body to be buried in a decent Christian like manner and as to my worldly estate that it hath pleased Almighty to endow me with in manner of form as followeth.

I give first land my land & Plantations to my living wife Rachel Hayes during her natural life also four Cows & three yearlings & one horse and my House hold furniture and after her death I give the whole to my Daughter Elizabeth Hayes to her heirs forever and further I nominate & appoint my loving wife & my brother Solomon Hayes my whole & sole executors of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I set my hand this tenth day of May 1783

Richard Hayes Will

In the name of God amen I Richard Hayes of Northampton County North Carolina being very sick in body & weak but of perfect sound memory thanks be given unto God calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & testament

that is to say first & principally I give & recommend my soul unto the hand of almighty God that gave it and my Body I command to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection time I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewithal I have pleasure God to bless me in this life I give & devise & dispose of the same in the following manner & form Item It is my desire that my part in two plantations and a tract of land in Halifax County be sold to discharge my lawful debt if there may be more than satisfy the debt I desire it may return into my estate to be equally divided between my heirs and if there should not be enough for as much of my stock & household furniture as may do it at the discretion of my executors

Item I give to my beloved wife Annular one man named ~~John~~ ^{the} Lewis & his one negro man named Lewis during his natural life & one negro man named Major during his natural life & one feather bed of furniture during his natural life.

Item I give unto my beloved daughter Martha Hyde one negro man named John or feather bed & furniture.

Item I give to my beloved daughter Annular ^{one} negro girl named Cherry one feather bed & furniture.

Item It is my desire that after the death of my wife that the two negro men Lewis & Moses & the feather bed before mentioned be equally divided between my two daughters before mentioned and I do appoint & ordain my wife Annular & John Lewis & Benjamin Lashley ^{the} trustees of this my last will & testament & I do hereby utterly disallow revoke & cancel all former wills & legacies whatsoever & whence to be my last & just testament I witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and

 to him to his heirs forever after my wife deceased

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Gay five shillings
 and no more.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Martha Reynolds
 five shillings & no more,

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Baker five shil-
 lings & no more,

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Prudence Gay
 all the remainder of my Estate in Doost two negro
 fellows Peter & Ben to be at her disposal,

Item I give & bequeath to my Grandson Solomon Gay five shillings
 & no more,

Item I give & bequeath to my Granddaughter Prudence Gay
 Eliza Gay five shillings cash & no more, & for other mem-
 ories & apparel. Joseph Atherton George Barkley
