do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament in manner and form following
First I commend my soul to Almighty God
hoping through the merits of beloved Saviour
Jesus Christ that he will vouchsafe to receive
it and my body to the earth to be decently
buried at the discretion of my Executors
hereafter mentioned and for what worldly
estate it has pleased God bestow me in
this life I dispose of in manner and form
following. Item I do leave to my wife
Sarah Johnson a Negro Woman name Patsy
and a Negro boy name Dread till his death
or marriage Item I do give and bequeath to
my son John Johnson the above mentioned
Negro Dread at my wife Death or marriage
Item I do give unto my son James Johnson
her aforesaid mentioned negro Paty at my wife
death or marriage —
Item I do give and bequeath to my son Isham Johnson
a Negro Woman named Sarah and her increase
from this date Item I do give and bequeath
to my Daughter Ann Clark five pounds.
Item I do leave to my wife Sarah Johnson her
choice feather bed and a Rug and blanket and
two pair Sheets and the other furniture
belonging to it and two Cows and Calves and two
Hogs and two Sheep and three duck as the
masters choice of with two sons & Pigs eight
head of less year old Hogs my youngest son

Saddar & beddall my Cow & cald & three hores of
Sheep two goats & an Goat two Box iron & feathers
Crock are & wearing her three Case knives & scissars
& my meat Brandy & whal & Hunders & wool & usmme
Cotton as the likest Hehest Med Sifter of my leather
my Tubs & pales & desk two Basons two Earthen 13 gal.
two Mugs half a dozen of plates half a dozen of spars
stable, Item I do give and bequeath to my son
James Johnson two Cows & also three hores
of Sheep & eight head of young hogs then quey,
Item I do leave now my Debts to be paidt the
remainder part of my Estate personal & real to be
equally divided between my son John Johnson & my
son Isham Johnson, Item now I glisow at my
wife each a morsage what she leaves of
my Estate that it may be equally divided between
my son James Johnson and my grand son
William Johnson and I do appoint and ordain
my son John Johnson my whole Executor
of this my last Will and Testament in witness
whereunto I do set my hand and affix my seal
this the thirteenth day of August anno Domini
1777.

her increase one feather bed & furnished & a mare colt
Colia pleasure, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch unto my
grand son John Bap son of Isaac Bap a negro girl
named Fanny & her increase, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch
unto my son Abraham Bap one negro girl named
Phillis her increase, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch unto
my Grand son Job Bap a negro girl named
Dun this in colour & one feather bed & furnished
Item I give Cevie Shiquatch unto my Grand son Ceci-
el Bap son of Job Bap my land & plantation
whereon I now do live containing two hundred acres
more or less my negro fellow named Sharper my
old dog & a negro boy named Seaton to
him his heirs & assigns forever, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch
unto my Grand son Uriah Bap son of Fanny my land &
plantation whereon the said Fanny now lives contain-
ing one hundred acres more or less joining Duckham-
Branch and Mapes Branch also the half of my land
lying in Rurita Swamp joining Col. Dawson's line
also a negro woman named Hannah her increase
hereafter also a negro boy named Ben to him his
heirs & assigns forever Item I give Cevie Shiquatch
unto my daughter Alice Empson a negro woman
