William Johnsons Will 290

In the name of God Amen. I William
Johnson of Hampton County in the province
of North Carolina being of sound memory
Thanks be to Almighty God for the same I
do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament in manner and form following
First I commend my soul to Almighty God
hoping through the merits of blessed Saviour
Jesus Christ that he will vouchsafe to receive
it and my body to the earth to be decently
buried at the discretion of my Executor
hereafter mentioned and for what worldly
Estate it has pleased God to bestow upon me in
this life I dispose of in manner and form
following. First I do leave to my wife
Sarah Johnson a Negro Women name Pull
and a Negro boy name Dred till he death
or marriage then I do give and bequeath to
my son John Johnson the above mentioned
Negro Dred. at my wife's death or marriage
then I do give unto my son James Johnson
the above mentioned negro Pot. at my wife's
death or marriage —
then I do give and bequeath to my son William Johnson
a Negro Women name Sarah and her increase
from this date then I do give and bequeath
to my Daughter Ann Clark five pounds.
then I do leave to my wife Sarah Johnson her
choise feather bed and rug and blanket and
two pair sheets and the other furniture
belonging to it and two Pows and Pulley and two
Hefing and two Shaws and three such as she
may choose of with two Sows & Higgs eight
head of live year old Hogs my young

Saddles & bridles my Cows & fodder three head of
 Sheep two goats & pan Grist Iron Box iron & leather
 broad axe & wearing hoe three Case knives & forks
 & my meat & many other Horses & wood & as much
 Cattle as the letter Hebest meal softer & my leather
 my Tools & plates & dishes two Basins two Certhen Bases
 two (nearly half a dozen of plates half a dozen of pans)
 stable, Item I do give and bequeath to my son
 James Johnson two Cows & Horses three head
 of Sheep & eight head of young hogs three geese,
 Item I do leave now my debts to be paid & the
 remainder part of my estate personal & real to be
 equally divided between my son John Johnson & my
 son Isham Johnson, then most I explain at my
 wife's death or marriage what she leaves of
 my Estate that it may be equally divided between
 my son James Johnson and my grand son
 William Johnson and I do appoint and ordain
 my son John Johnson my whole Executor
 of this my last Will and Testament in witness
 whereunto I do set my hand and affix my seal
 this the thirtieth day of August Anno Domini

 of sound mind & memory do make constitute appoint &
 ordain this my last will & Testament in manner &

 her increase, Item I give devise bequeath unto my
 son Isaac Bap two negro women named Rose & Moll &
 their increase one feather bed & furniture & a mare Colt
 called pleasant, Item I give devise bequeath unto my
 grand son John Bap son of Isaac Bap a negro girl
 named Fanny & her increase, Item I give devise bequeath
 unto my son Abraham Bap one negro Girl named
 Phillis & her increase, Item I give devise bequeath unto
 my grand son Job Bap one negro Girl named
 Gunther & her increase & one feather bed & furniture
 Item I give devise bequeath unto my grand son Coas
 el Bap son of Jethro Bap my land & plantation
 wherein I now do live containing two hundred and
 more or less my negro fellow named Sharper my
 still & a negro boy named Deaton to
 him his heirs & assigns forever, Item I give devise bequeath
 unto my grand son Uriah Bap son of Drury my land &
 plantation wherein the said Drury now lives contain
 ing one hundred Acres more or less joining Duckham
 Branch and Maps & also the half of my land
 lying in Neraka Swamp joining Cole Bays one line
 also a negro woman named Hannah & her increase
 hereafter also a negro boy named Bone to him his
 heirs & assigns forever Item I give devise bequeath
 unto my daughter Mrs. Engr one negro woman
