

## Thomas Fullalls Will

- In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Fullall of Northampton County in North Carolina, being very sick & weak in body, but in perfect sense & memory, thank be God, do hereby make & ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following. I give & bequeath my soul to God, trusting and confidently believing that by the mighty & Jesus Christ my soul shall be saved, and my body to the earth from whence it came to be buried in decent Order at the discretion of my executors, & as for my worldly Estate, I give & bequeath in manner & form following. First, I doe that all my lawful debts & general charges be paid, also I give one suit of cloth that, to have basis, is to waccote my wife.
- Item I give & bequeath to my leaving Hannah Fullall one bed & furniture, also I give to my wife one desk six plates, one pair of knives, forks, one trunk, one side saddle, one rifle.
- Item I give & bequeath to my son Eun Patric my negro man named Tong, only my will is that my wife shalld have the Labor of him two years, then this said Negro Tong to be sold by the ear of the money I give to my son Eun, when he is twenty one years old.
- Item I give & bequeath to my son Eun Patric my new Roppe & all that all debts & charges be paid with the money that arises from the sale of my Hogs, also I give the remainder part of the Hogs to my son Eun.
- Item I give & bequeath to my son Dempsey Fullall my Great Mill & all the Cutt ments therunto belonging to him this instant & forever, also I give & bequeath my manor plantation & all the land therunto belonging to my son Dempsey Fullall to him his heirs & assigns forever, also I give & bequeath to my son Sam Joyner, all my Tools for Cropping, also I give what Geathers I have out of my Bed to my son Dempsey.
- Item I give & bequeath to my two daughters Charity Fullall & Meriam Fullall, two feather beds & furniture & all the remainder of my Duster, one desk save my Chairs, Tables, & one Case of bottles & two mams, this to be equally divided

between them by the judgment of two men.

- Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Charity, Fullall one Cow & Calf also one side Saddle.
- Item I give & bequeath to my son Saunders Fullall one bed & Rugg.
- Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Anna, Jenkinsone shipman
- Item I give & bequeath to my son John Fullall the book called the history of Africa
- Item I give & bequeath to my wife two Daughters Charity & Meriam also Flax & Cotton to be equally divided among them, also giving my meat & corn for the use of my Family.
- Item I give & bequeath unto my two daughters Charity Fullall & Meriam Fullall all the Remainder of my household Goods
- Item I give & bequeath unto my three Sons David, Dempsey & Sam Fullall all my stock of Cattle to be equally divided among them, And this I ordain to be my last will & do appoint & my three Sons Saunders, David & Dempsey Fullall Executrix in writing whereunto I have set my hand & seal this 27<sup>th</sup> of March in the year 1770.
- Signed sealed & pronounced, Thomas Fullall & sealed in presence of us,
- John Fullall, Pitt & Brown Benjamin <sup>his</sup> mark <sup>mark</sup> Patrec.
- Northampton County, N. C. Jan 27 1770.

## Lucy Poisers Will

- In the Name of God Amen. Lucy Poisers of Northampton County & Province of North Carolina, being sick & weak of Body, but of sound & perfect memory, do make this my last will & testament in manner & form following.
- Item I give & bequeath to my Son William Poisers my Plantation whereon I now live, with all the lands to me belonging, I give to my Son William Poisers to be at his own Dispossession likewise give & bequeath to my Son William Poisers all my

whole Estate within doors & without, all the accountably substance  
wherein it hath pleased god to bless me, I give to my son  
William Symer <sup>of</sup> whatever authority & appoint my <sup>beloved</sup> Son  
William Symer, the full sole exec of this my last will &  
Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &  
Seal this 2<sup>nd</sup> day October 1751. *X* <sup>mark</sup>  
Signed sealed & declared in presence of *X* <sup>mark</sup>  
Kath<sup>r</sup> Williams, Ely Williams.

*The Testimony of John Sawyer*

---

In the name of God amen. I John Sawyer of Northampton County,  
being at present sick & weak of Body, but of sound mind &  
memory, thanks be to god, therefore, but calling to mind the  
mortality of my body & constitute & ordain this my last  
Will & Testament in manner herein following that is to say  
first & principally, I commit my soul into the hands of  
almighty God, hoping to have full & free pardon of all  
my sins, to inherit everlasting life, as for my Body I  
desire it to be given from whence it was taken, to be  
buried in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion  
of my Executors hereafter named, as touching all such  
Temporal Estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow  
upon me I give & dispose thereof as followeth.

Item I desire that all my just debts be paid & funeral charge  
Item I give & bequeath the use of my Land & Plantation to Mrs. Martha Carter  
during her natural life either at the day of her death, or if necessary  
I give the same to my Cousin James Marshbury  
Item I give & bequeath to Martha Carter one further bed, two Shuts  
of a Blanket, & two Cowstalls down, eighteen Gisea four boards  
of Corn, one Iron Pot, one water Pail, one Pewter Ditch, two Plates  
three Spoons, three knives & forkes

All the residue & remainder of my Estate good & chattels within  
and without doors, my will & desire is for it to be sold for money  
the money equally divided among my brothers & sisters Children  
and to constitute & appoint my Friend James Butler & my  
Cousin James Marshbury, my whole sole Executors of this my last  
will & Testament making disannulling & Making void all other  
Wills herefore made by me. In witness whereof I have here  
unto set my hand seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of August 1770.

Milly, Ralph & Nat, to her/his forever.

Item My alio & desire is that my Slave shall be sold to pay my just  
debts, also all my slaves house furniture & Stock except one feather  
bed.

Item I give to Sarah Abrams one gallo ring, I do constitute and  
appoint my wife, Thomas Edwards, & Benjamin Washington  
whole Sale exec of this my last will & testament as before
