Bess & I give her one feather Bed & Slugg &c

Item I give unto my Daughter Joanna Tomson & her heirs
forever ninety acres of land being the Plantation that he now
lives on, I also give her a negro Fellow Called Shufes after
the death of his Mother I give her a Negro Woman Called Sall
to her heirs forever also one Negro Boy Called Harry After
the death of my dear Daughter the said Negro Boy Harry
to my Grand Son Ethel Tomson.

Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Washington one negro boy
Called Jonah & one negro girl Called Lucy to her heirs
forever & I give her one feather Bed & Slugg.

Item I give unto my Daughter Lydia Washington her heirs forever one
negro girl Called Siner & one Negro Boy Called Phil & I give her
one feather Bed & Slugg & one gold Ring.

Item I give unto my Granddaughter Mary Lundy one Negro boy named
Jack & one negro boy Called Arthur on the proviso that the boy
is the age of eighteen years old or married if not the said
Negro to be equally divided amongst the rest of my Children.

My will & desire is that my Negro Fellow Frank may be sold to pay
my just Debts by my executors here after named & all the remaining
part of my estate to be equally divided amongst all my Children
after the death of their mother I do constitute & appoint my
son Robert Washington & Boy Washington & Washington

Ethel Washington & my Son in Law Charles Tomson whole
& sole executors of this my last will & testament as & attorney my
hand & seal this 8th day of December 1766

This will of James Washington above was exhibited into Court & proven
by the subscribing witnesses. Wm Murfey Mr. the Washington & Oliver
Washington at the same time resided in Northampton & other
Washington were qualified as executors thereof which is ordered
to be Certified & Recorded.

At May Court 1766. Charles Washington was qualified as one of the exec-
utors. After Court Robert & Binya. At the Willies Jones
Washington were qualified as executors of this will.

& Province of North Carolina, being sick & weak, but of sound disposing
mind & memory, do declare this to be my last will & testament hereby
reaching all others.

I promise my will & desire is that my Body be decently buried after my death
Item I give to my brother Harwood Jones my tract of land joining my
said Brothers Plantation on a necky swamp to him his heirs
& assigns forever provided that my said Brother Harwood paying debts
one hundred pound Virginia Money within six months after my death
to the said land shall be confirmed.

Item my will & desire is that my negroes Continue on the said Plantation
till the crop now growing thereon is finished & that then the money
arising from the sale thereof & all other money together with the stock
I also desire my negroes to be appraised & that my brother Tignal
take his first choice at the appraisement of either of my other Brothers
things proper they may take any share at the appraisement also I pur-
sue my will that my personal Estate before mentioned be equally
divided amongst all my brothers & my sister Lydia & her

Cousin Elizabeth Smith & my Cousin John Jones Tinson
may share an equal part of my estate with my Brothers
Brothers that they may all above mentioned have & share alike
Item before the above division I give to my Sister Elizabeth Jones
100£ to my Brother Harwood ten pounds Cash & two trunks to
my Brother Sigal I give my bay Riding Horse and all my books
and I constitute & appoint my Brother Harwood and Sigal
Jones Executors of this my last will & testament to direct them

I Robert Jones junr of the County of Northampton in the Province
of North Carolina Attorney at Law being of sound & disposing
Mind & memory thanks to Almighty God do make & ordain
this my last will & testament in manner following that
is to say First I bequeath my soul to Almighty God
that gave it hoping for remission of my sins that his mercy
by the advocacy & mediation of my dear blessed Saviour
Jesus Christ and my body to the earth to be decently buried
& to本着 such worldly estate as it hath pleased the Almighty
God of his great goodness to commit to my stewardship I give
& dispose thereof as follows

Imprimis I give & bequeath unto my wife Mary the Plantation and Land
whereon I now live being the same I purchased of Samuel Dalling
also two hundred acres of Landth I purchased of Thomas Jones
& the land I purchased of Thomas Bobbitt all situated in the Oceanary

Next & containing in the whole eight hundred & forty acres more
or less which said Plantation & Land I give & bequeath to the said
Mary for during the term of her natural life the Committeeing
no estate, in full Satisfaction of her reasonable Dower of the all
the Land tenements & her chattels, whereof I have been desirous
at any time since my intermarriage with her & from time
immediately after the decease of the said Mary or other determina-
tion of her Estate in the said Plantation & Land I give & bequeath
the same to the residuum & residue Remainder & Remainders therof
unto my son William Jones his heirs & assigns forever

Item I give & bequeath to my dauldray Mary during the term of her natural
life so long as upon the depreh Condition herein after mentioned
not otherwise my twelve Negro Slaves named as follows
to wit, Linda the sempstress Betty Hiller, Daughter Ned Hiller
Bob, Hardy, Tom, Lawyer, Ned, Nettie, Amy, Nathaniel
Melinda & Billy, heron of me & immediately after the decease
of any said wife I give & bequeath the said Negro Girl Anna &
with all ~~and~~ increase as she shall have after my decease
unto my son Miller Jones, his heirs & assigns for ever & from
immediately after the decease of my said wife as aforesaid
I give & bequeath the other aforementioned Elvira & her
all their future increase unto my two sons Allen & Miller
equally between them to be divided share & share alike
But my will & meaning is that of my said wife shall refuse
to take & except the Plantation & Land herein before given
in full Satisfaction of her dower, in all the lands
whereof I have been desirous at any time since my intermar-
riage with her or shall offer to sue or disturb either of my
sons or any person to whom I have sold any land, for
Dower in my Lands which they or any of them hold or claim
by title from or under me, that from & immediately after
such refusal suing or disturbing the aforesaid legacy
of twelve Negro Slaves here by me given to my said wife
shall cause determine & become utterly void & that then
& from thenceforth I bequeath the said Negro Girl
