

Boy Called Kitt & one negro Boy Called Mott to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & give unto my son Ethel Washington his heirs forever two hundred acres of land on the South side of Turkey Creek joining Richard Andersons Land and the Land of his Brother John & I give one negro Boy Called Lewis & one Called Charles & I give him one feather Bed.

Item I give & give unto my son Nicholas Washington two hundred acres of land to him & his heirs forever lying on the north side of little Creek joining the said Creek & the Land I give his brother John & Ethel & I give him one negro Boy Called Bull & one negro Called Pipe & I give one negro girl Called Beek & I give him one feather Bed & 4 Haggles.

Item I give unto my Daughter Joanna Tomson & her heirs forever ninety acres of land being the Plantation that she now lives on & I also give her a negro Woman Called Sheest after the death of her Mother & I give her a Negro Woman Called Sell to her & her heirs forever also one Negro Boy Called Davy & after the death of my said Daughter the said Negro Boy Davy to my Grandson Ethel Tomson.

Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Washington one negro boy Called Benish & one negro girl Called Lucy to her & her heirs forever & I give her one Feather Bed & 4 Haggles.

Item I give unto my Daughter Jem Washington & her heirs forever one negro girl Called Biner & one Negro Boy Called Phil & I give her one feather Bed & 4 Haggles & one gold Ring.

Item I give unto my Granddaughter Mary Lundy one Negro boy named Luke & one negro boy Called Arthur on the proviso that she live to the age of eighteen years old or married if not the said negroes to be equally divided amongst the rest of my Children.

My will & desire is that my Negro Wallow & Sarah may be sold to pay my just Debt by my Executors hereafter named & all the remaining part of my Estate to be equally divided amongst all my Children after the death of their Mother & I do constitute & appoint my son Robert Washington Boy Washington & John Washington

Ethel Washington & my son in Law Charles Tomson whole & sole Executors of this my last will & Testament as acting by my hand & seal this 8th Day of December 1766.

Signed sealed in the presence of William Blufford, ^{James} Washington, ^{Elizabeth} Washington, ^{mark} Northampton County May Court 1766.

This will of James Washington deceased was exhibited into Court & proven by the subscribing witnesses. The same for Martha Washington & John Washington at the same time exhibited & Washington & John Washington were qualified as Executors thereof which is ordered to be Certified & recorded.

In the Name of God Amen I William Jones of the County of Northampton & Province of North Carolina, being sick & weak, but of sound disposing Mind & Memory, do declare this to be my last will & Testament hereby revoking all others.

Expressing my will & desire is that my Body be decently buried after my death.

Item I give to my brother Harwood Jones my tract of Land joining my said Brothers Plantation and a canebrake swamp to him & his heirs & assigns forever, provided that my said Brother Harwood pay my debts or hundred pounds Virginia Money within six months after my death to the said Land shall be confirmed.

Item my will & desire is that my negroes continue on the said Plantation till the crop now growing thereon is finished & that then the money arising from the sale thereof & all other money together with the Stock I also desire my negroes be appraised & that my brother Thomas take his first Choice at the appraisement if either of my other Brothers think proper they may take any share at the appraisement also I further desire that my personal Estate before mentioned be equally divided amongst all my Brothers & my Sister Legda also my

Cousin Elizabeth Smith & my Cousin John Jones Tomson
may share an equal part of my estate with my Brothers
Winters that they may all above mentioned have & share alike
I give to my Sister Elizabeth Jones
wife to my Brother Harwood ten pounds Cash & two trunks to
my Brother Signal I give my bay Riding Horse and all my books
and I constitute & appoint my Brother Harwood and Signal
Jones Executors of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my Hand & fixed my seal this 14th day of
July Anno Domini 1766 William Jones Seal

Robert Jones Will

In the name of God Amen April 6th 1764.

I Robert Jones Jun of the County of Northampton in the Province
of North Carolina, Attorney at Law, being of sound mind & disposing
mind I memory thanks to Almighty God do make & declare
this my last will & Testament in manner following that
is to say, I do bequeath my soul to Almighty God
that gave it hoping for remission of my sins thro his mercy
by the advocacy & mediation of my ever blessed Saviour
Jesus Christ and my body to the earth to be decently buried
& something such wretched Estate as it hath pleased the Almighty
God of his great goodness to commit to my Stewardship. I give
& dispose thereof as follows

First I give bequeath unto my wife Mary the Plantation and Land
whereon I now live being the same I purchased of Samuel Dotling
also two hundred acres of Land ^{that} I purchased of Thomas Jones
& the Land purchased of Thomas Bobbet all situated in the County

Neck & containing in the whole Eight hundred & forty Acres more
or less which said Plantation & Land I give & devise to the said
Mary for & during the term of her natural life, she committing
no estate, in her satisfaction of her reasonable power of & in all
the said tenements & her necessaries, whosoever I have been & shall
at any time since my intermarriage with her & from time
immediately after the decease of the said Mary, or other determi-
nation of her Estate in the said Plantation & Land. I give & devise
the same to her executors & assigns the Remainder & Remainders thereof
unto my son William Jones his heirs & assigns forever

I give bequeath to my said wife Mary during the term of her natural
life no longer & upon the Express Condition herein after mentioned
& not otherwise my Twelve Negro Slaves named as follows
to wit, Ann & the Impress Betty, Sheller, Daught, & Ned Kell-
low, Bob, Hardy, Sam, Sawyer, Nees, Bitten, Amy, Nathana-
Melinda & Betty, heron & from & immediately after the decease
of my said wife, I give bequeath the said Negro Girl Annaca
with all ~~the~~ increase as she shall have after my decease
unto my son William Jones, his heirs & assigns for & ever & from
& immediately after the decease of my said wife as aforesaid
I give bequeath the other aforesaid twelve Negro Slaves
all their future Increase unto my two sons William & William
Equally between them to be divided share & share alike
But my will & meaning is, that if my said wife shall refuse
to take & accept the Plantation & Land herein before given
in her full satisfaction of her dower, in all the Land
whereof I have been seized at any time since my intermar-
riage with her or shall offer to sue or disturb either of my
sons or any person to whom I have sold any Land, for
Dower in my Land which they or any of them hold or claim
by title from or under me, that from & immediately after
such refusal or disturbing the aforesaid Legacy
of twelve Negro Slaves here by me given to my said wife
shall cease & determine & become utterly void & that then
& from thence forth I give bequeath the said Negro Girl
