

Martha Lamon Will

In the name of God amew. I Martha Lamon of the County of Northampton, in the Province of North Carolina, being in sound disposing mind & memory thankes be to God. callinge unto me this transitory life knowing it was appropiate for all persons once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & testament, that is to say first of all to give & recommend my soul to god that gave it me, & my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors touching my worldly estate I give & dispose of the same in manner following that is to say.

I give & bequeath unto my son John Lamon his wife law, named Briston & the other named French likewise one negro woman named Mary & also one negro woman named Lucy, also one negro boy called Jacob & one negro boy called Tom, likewise one negro girl named Nancy also one negro girl named Pig & one negro girl named Jenny, also one negro boy named Tony, all to him & his heirs forever. Likewise I give & bequeath to my son John Lamon one large black walnut Chest of Drawers, & one large black walnut over table, & likewise one black walnut desk & black walnut square table, likewise one small walnut dressing Table, & likewise I give to him three feather beds & all their furniture therunto belonging. Likewise likewise black walnut chairs, also one corner cupboard & one large hope chest, also one small leather trunk, likewise also my stock of cattle in them more or less, also I give to him four breeding mares & one Trumpet & eight Galloway, also one iron bell & small iron pot, also I give to my son John Lamon all the furniture that belongs to the inside of the corner cupboard also four Dishes & one dozen & half of Pewter plates & three basins, two dozen & half of Spoons, also one Crop Cut saw likewise six branding irons, & two guns & one small tea chest also one broken case of bottles & one Candle box, also one pair of Iron Coops, all to him this heirs forever.

Likewise I give to my son John Lamon all my land lying on the north & south side of Oak Creek in the County of Halifax to him & his heirs forever. also I give to my son John Lamon one large looking Glass to him this heirs forever. also I give to my son John Lamon one negro girl called Sue to him this heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto Starling Thomas son of the present wife of John Barnes one tract of land of purchase of my brother Thomas Jones containing two hundred & forty acres but more or less lying on the north side of Oak Creek near the expet to him this heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son James Barnes five shillings to him this heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son John Barnes five shillings to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Barnes five shillings to him this heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Barber five shillings to her this heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Catherine Bodie five shillings to her this heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Martha Bodie the best part of my wearing apparel, and also my riding saddle to her this heirs forever.

I now appoint my son John Lamon whoe sole exec of this my last will & testament, making & disannulling all other wills by me made in writing whereof I sign this to be my last will & testament signed & sealed on the presence of all these ^{her} John Lamon & as aforesaid the 8th day of Sept 1770.
