Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Lapsiter
 my riding mare and saddle and bridle to her and
 her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my two daughters Sarah
 & Isabella Lapsiter all my stock of Cattle and hogs
 to be equally divided between them Both and my
 two feathered Birds and from time to time and
 their heirs forever also my two pots and piggins
 from to them & their heirs forever and all the
 rest of my valuable Estate to be equally
 divided amongst all my children and of
 this my last will and testament which
 I do make and ordain and appointing my
 friends and well beloved friend my wife Isabella

sold and again divided among many children to
them and their heirs forever.
