with it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give
and bequeath in manner & form following.
Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Laddister & my loving
wife Pleasant Laddister my land that come by my wife,
to be equally divided between them.

I likewise give & bequeath to my son William Laddister my
Negro which called Pigg to him this his & to take & for
ever all at the age of twenty one years & my loving wife
to have the use of all until he comes of age & the rest
of my estate I give unto my wife to help to ransom my self
and of this my last will and testament I make constitutions
& appoint my truly & well beloved wife Pleasant Laddister
(my well beloved) brother James Laddister my whole &
sole executors revoking disannulling all other former
wills by me heretofore made, ratifying & confirming this
& none other to be my last will & Testament In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day
the year first above written. I Jacob Laddister ^{his} mark
signed sealed published & pronounced. Jacob Laddister ^{mark}
& delivered by the said testator to be his last will & Testament in presence of us
