In the name of God Amen, William Hagland being sick & weak but in perfect sense & memory do make & ordain this my last will & Testament in the following manner.

- Item I give bequeath unto Elizabeth Neal Daughter of John & Mary Neal one negro by the name of Ned to her & her heirs or assigns.
 - Item I give bequeath unto Sarah Neal Daughter of John & Mary Neal one negro girl by the name of Frank to her & her heirs or assigns.
 - Item I give bequeath unto the two above mentioned Girls an equal part of the allacy due from my brother Stephen Hagland to them & their heirs or assigns. Lastly I appoint my loving brother Stephen Hagland & my friend Thomas Barrett Just to be Executors of this my last will & Testament receiving all others or former wills, by me heretofore made by me and witnessed hereof I have set my hand & feet my seal this thirty first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty three.

Sylvia Gregory's Will.

In the name of God Amen I Sylvia Gregory of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina at present being very sick & weak of body but of perfect sound mind & memory, Thanks be to God therefor, but calling to mind the mortality of my body doth give & dispose my goods & chattels in manner & form following -

Item I give & bequeath unto Arthur Gregory six pounds Virginia money to him & his heirs forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto Riggiah Gregory & Charlotte Gregory daughter of Aaron Gregory &c the residue & surplus of my estate to be equally divided between them two, my desire is that my negro Anck Patience may be sold & the money may be divided equally among them two Riggiah Gregory & Charlotte Gregory to them & their heirs forever -

I do constitute & appoint Arthur Gregory my whole & sole Executor to this my last Will & Testament did nothing & making void all other Wills by me heretofore made, as Witness my hand & seal this 5th day of November 1777 -
