It is also my will that the negro, old Sam Robin Pompey Roostpink to be de Kato I have small Children, that is fallen to let out, shall be kept & work on my plantation but he's out until my son John Neal comes to the age of twenty one year, then it is my will that the whole of my negroes & all the remainder of my estate be equally divided between my two sons & hereby constitute & ordain my loving friend, John Knox & Thomas White of the County aforesaid to be my last will & testament & to hereby divide & make out all & every other former testaments, wills & legacies by me made Ratifying this & no other to be my last will & testament. Mary Heath of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina being very sick at present but of perfect sound mind & memory thanks be to God therefor but calling to mind the mortality of the Body both given & disposed of my Goods & Chattels in the manner & form following

I give & bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Dawson Barnes one piece of the best furniture one cow & yielding my great part to her has heirs forever

I give & bequeath unto my son John Dawson Harris my Colt that

now lacks the mare of all my part of my fathers Estate that I have not here to him this heirs forever

I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Harris one piece of the best furniture one floor what my son & my son in law Christy my son & his wife get four pounds p^{annu} to her heirs forever

And my will is that my negroes Jacob & Lydia & of all other children be sold & the money arising from their sale to be put to the use of raising my two small Children, William Hart & Edmund Hart until they come to the age of fifteen years old & my will is that at the end of the above fifteen years that all my negroes shall be equally divided between my three youngest Children, Elizabeth Harris, William Hart & Edmund Hart to them & their heirs forever & my will is that if either of my three youngest Children shall die before they come of age that their part of my Estate shall be divided between the other two & my will is that the remainder of my Estate may be sold to pay my debts & the remainder of the money of the debts shall be equally divided between my three Children Elizabeth Harris, William Hart & Edmund Hart to them & their heirs forever

And I do constitute & appoint Henry Smith & Balaco Barnes my whole sole Executors of this my last will & testament & in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23^d day of October 1781

John Songs Will

In the name of God amen I John Song of the County of Northampton being very sick but of a sound & disposing mind & memory,

- thanks be to god do make & ordain this my last will & testament in manner of form following to wit,
- Item I give the use of my Plantation whereon I now live to my beloved Wife during her life or widowhood, & all the Crop that is on my Plantation to raise & Educate my Children on also the use of my other Plantations together with all my negro & stock till my Eldest Daughter comes of age or marry & all the Children comes of age my desire is that they may have their several Shares hereafter to be mentioned, and in case my wife shall decease before my Children comes of age then my will & desire is that she shall my negro Charles to be at her own disposal, & on feather bed & furniture all the kitchen furniture & one Dish & table.
- Item I give my watch unto my Daughter Mary Long one negro called milly one felly one feather bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever.
- Item I give my watch unto my Daughter Elizabeth Long one negro called Big one feather bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever.
- Item I give my watch unto my Daughter Susannah Long one negro called Bob one feather bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever.
- Item I give my watch unto my son James Long his Chain of one half of my land which was formerly King Hanly & also half of the land I bought of Edwad who is to be divided by my son and after to be mentioned also two negroes named Sam & Flower to him & his heirs forever.
- Item I give my watch unto my son Richard Long the other half of my land which was formerly owned by King Hanly & James Edward also two negroes named Harriet & Helen to him & his heirs forever.
- Item I give my watch unto my son Robert Long the Plantation whereon I now live with all the land I bought of Robert Liker & others Curran Cook also two negroes named Sam & Peter to him & his heirs forever.
- Item my further will & desire is that all the remainder part of my Estate which I do not will away be equally divided amongst

all my Children when my Daughter Mary Long comes of age, I also do constitute & appoint my friends Rowen & Edmund James Sunday & Thomas Branch my whole sole Executors of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affix my seal this first day of October 1781.

In the name of God amen I Arthur Tynes of Northampton County in the Province of North Carolina being of perfect mind & memory thanks be to God do make constitute & ordain this to be my last will & testament in manner of form following to wit,

- Item First of all my will & desire is that all my debts funeral Charges shall be paid & discharged.
- Item I give unto my Mother Elizabeth Tynes two hundred acres of land at the Place called Brushy Pond during her natural life.
- Item I give unto my Brother Nicholas Tynes forty five acres of land one Cow & quarding one Jacket Horse, three yearlings & a colt two cows & one heifer five Cattle in small also one Linen shirt one pair of shoes four hats one Gallon of oil of Bonyng one note of hand of King Trustees & one note of hand of David Johnston & two silver Hoops.
- Item I give unto my brother Lewis Tynes one Saw & Trip, one young horse one Saddle & bridle, one grubbing bar, two axes one cutting bar one weathered & two pair of brushes one bond one pair of shoes one comb.
- Item I give unto my Mother Elizabeth Tynes one silver case & two tin barrels one new blanket.
- Item I give unto my Sister Priscilla Tynes one black silk Handkerchief one Dress one silver Plate.
