In the name of God amen I David Winborne of NoCarolina in the County of Northampton being very sick & weak of body but thank god of great dispensing sense & memory calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life am willing to make my last will & dispose of my estate as follows.

First of all I bequeath my soul to god that gave it me & my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors my funeral expenses discharged & debts paid I bequeath my estate as follows.

Item I give & bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Winborne one cow & half the land one acre I also give to my wife three head of sheep one sow & eight hoggs one box of furniture & a rug given to my wife Elizabeth Winborne the use of one negro girl named Pipp for the term of eight years the whole of my power I likewise give to my wife & also two iron pots one case of knives forks one linen whell two doiling whell one shot & trunk two chairs.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son James Winborne the plantation whereon I now live the land belonging to it to him & his heirs forever & touching the plantation I have already given to my son my desire is that my wife Elizabeth Winborne may have the use of the old plantation during her life if it be god's will that my wife be so long alive & of the children unborn I give to it one negro girl named Pipp & her increase forever my desire is that if either of my children die before they come of age the other shall have his property my desire is that the remainder of my perishable estate may be sold & the money equally divided between my two children And I do leave James Winborne my wife Elizabeth Winborne executors of this my last will & testament making & disallowing of any other will or wills made by me confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have caused to set my hand & seal this twenty second day of August one thousand seven hundred & forty eight

Item I give & beguath unto my son James Winborne the Plantation whereon I now live the land belonging to it to him & his heirs forever & touching the plantation I have already given to my son my desire is that my wife Elizabeth Winborne may have the use of the old plantation during her life if it be god's will that my wife be safely delivered of the child unborn I give to it one negro girl named Pipp & her increase forever my desire is that if either of my children die before they comes of age the other shall have his property. my desire is that the remainder of my perishable Estate may be sold & the money equally divided between my two children. And I do leave James Winborne & my wife Elizabeth Winborne executors of this my last will & testament making & remitting of any other will or wills made by me confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament.
