Then I give and bequeath to my son Solomon Sanders
my negro boy Isaac and my negro girl doll and my
negro girl Sarah and my negro man the Briget
also my manum plantation with three hundred
and twenty acres of land to him and his heirs
forever

Then I give and bequeath all the rest of my estate to
be Equally divided between my two sons William
and Solomon Sanders after my wife's manage
and I do hereby recommend and constitute my
friend John Hove & Thomas Wier to be
my true & lawful Executors & Ad. of this
my last will and testament hereby manifesting
and disavowing all former and other wills and
testaments which was heretofore by me made con-
firming this and even other to be my last
will & testament in matters whereof I have
set herewith my hand and seal this 7th of Novr
1778 Signed Sealed & published pronounced & delivered
by Solomon Sanders as of his last will & testament

Mary Loring Will

In the name of god Amen I Mary Loring of
Manumpton County & province of the Carolinas being
sick & weak in body but of a disposing mind
I humbly thank be to god for it & knowing that
it is appointed for all Ordin to die I do hereby and
Ordain this my last will and testament bearing
all other will or wills made by me heretofore and
as what worldly goods it hath bequeathed will to
help me with I give & dispose of as follows

Then I give to my Brother Littlebury Loring one negro
woman named Rose one father Bed & all the furniture
belonging thereto to him & his heirs & assigns forever
Then to my Brother John Loring my daughter
my saddle & the same belonging to it & to her also
one pair of stays to her & her heirs forever

Then I give to my friend Samuel Burketts the sum
of twenty pounds for a reward money to him and
his heirs forever

Then I give the above mentioned Samuel Burketts
wife one Centinel One other friend one pair of
new Cloth shoes &c

Then I give to Sarah Graydon Church good one Cotton gown
One faith &c

Then I give to my sister Ann Loring one piece of China one
Cotton gown &c &c

Then I give to my sister Rebecca Loring one & China gown one
other friend one blue Camlet gown one black & red
one blue coat one black ring &c

Then I give the remaining fourth of my remaining apparel
to my sister Mr. Aaron & Rebecca to be equally divided &c

Then I give to my sister Rebecca Loring all the remaining
fourth of my estate to her & her heirs & assigns forever &c

Then I leave the power of my Executors to sell what part
of my estate Rebecca Loring Loring as they think

Proper and I do constitute and appoint my Brother
 Littlebury Jones & Joseph Williams my whole sole
 Executors of this my last will & testament in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal my
 seal this 6. day of Decr. 1778.

Wm. Gyners Will

In the name of god Amen I William Gyners of
 the County of Hampshire in the Province of New Hampshire
 being of perfect mind & memory thanks be given to
 almighty god for the same call me to mind the
 mortality that attend my body & it is appointed for
 all men once to die do make and constitute and
 constitute in this to be my last will & testament
 in manner & form following viz. First of all
 I commend my soul into the hands of almighty
 god that gave it hoping through the merits death
 & passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have
 full and free pardon and Remission of my sins
 and my body I commend to the Earth to be buried
 decent and Christian like manner at the discretion
 of my Executors hereafter named as to such
 worldly estate as it hath placed almighty god to
 upon me I give and bequeath in manner
 & form following viz.

Then first of all my will and desire is that all my debts
 and funeral charges ^{shall} be paid and discharged

Then I give and bequeath unto Bess Gyners four shillings & six pence
 then I give unto my daughter Martha Gyners four shillings & six pence
 then I give unto my son Arthur Gyners four shillings & six pence

then I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Davis four shillings & six pence

then I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Gyners the third
 part of all the third of any negroes she now
 owns also the third of my land also the third of all the
 rest of my Estate during her widowhood and if she
 should marry then to have but a child part and
 after my wife deceases or in case she should marry
 I then give unto my son Bess Gyners my negroes
 named Mears and if my wife should marry or die
 I then give my wife my daughter Sarah Gyners juster
 Gyners & Milla Gyners my Will

Then I give unto my three sons to wit Arthur Gyners Wm Gyners
 & Dore Gyners that part of land called the pine woods
 containing six hundred & forty acres more or less to be
 equally divided among my three sons Arthur Gyners
 & Dore the upper part called the Beech forest to
 Arthur Gyners the lower part called the turkeys Old field
 to Wm Gyners and the joining part to the land
 I now live on called Bitters to Dore Gyners & of all
 of them my said sons Arthur Wm. or Dore should
 die without issue the said part of land to be
 equally divided between the other two and likewise
 if Dore should die without issue one to have the half
 & if they all should die without issue I leave the
 said part of land to be equally divided between my
 four daughters to wit Mary Gyners Sarah Gyners
 Gyners Milla Gyners & if either of them should die
 without issue the equally divided among the
 rest of my said daughters here mentioned & also
 all the rest of my Estate to be equally divided among
