Robert Wilson's Will.

In the name of God Amen I Robert Wilson
of the County of Northampton & State of
North Carolina being of sound and disposing
mind and memory, but of weak and declin-
ing health of body do make this my last
will & Testament in the manner & form
following;

Item It is my will and ^{honest} desire that my Executors
before to be mentioned do first pay all my
Just debts.

Item I send unto my Loving wife Milla Malone
the Land & plantation whereon I now live
during her natural life also I send my living
wife my negro fellow Tom for the use & be-
nefit of my three youngest Children here
after mentioned Wif. Ann Elizabeth & John
Allen Malone until the youngest arrives
to the age of twenty one years after
marriage and at the expiration of which
time the said negro to be sold and equally
divided amongst all my then surviving
Children my will and desire also is that at
the death of my living wife that my Land
be sold at the discretion of my Executors
and divided amongst my then surviving
Children or their Heirs if any such there

Item be. I give and bequeath to my Living wife
Milla Malone two leather beds & furniture
half a dozen Pewter Plates half a dozen knives &
forks & one Iron Pot & Kettle & Chest three
Cows & Calves one Sow & Pigs four heads of Sheep
one Horse ^{Colored Staffords one Bredle Waggle} ^{one Sable her choice}
one cloth jump one Book called Basket &
any other of my Books she may choose to keep
one Cotton Trench one glass dial, two pewter
Dishes two basins one for Wood Cards one
Potter pot one Large Pitcher to be at her own
disposal, also all of my corn and one thousand
pounds of Pork.

Item My will and desire is at the division of my
Estate here before mentioned there be deducted
out of my two sons William & Charles

parts the following sum they having already received so much of my estate to wit William ten pounds Virginia money and Charles twenty two pounds ten Shillings of like money in order to make an equal division amongst my said Children.

Item It is also my will and desire, the Executors hereafter mentioned do continue to carry on the suit commenced against the Executors of ^{Wm} Bridgforth and as soon as German Baker my Attorney in that suit shall have recovered the property said for and shall have settled the same suit and given possession to my Executors of the said property that they do pay him the sum of fifty pounds Virginia money for his fee in said suit in the recovery of said property for which suit was commenced I say in agreement my will and laster desire is that on recovery of said property that it be equally divided amongst the lawful Claimants including my living wife Peter Malone one of them.

Item And lastly I nominate and appoint my two Sons William & Charles Malone and my well beloved friend Dennis Thile my Executors to this my last will & Testament given under my hand and seal this 24th day of November 1771 Signed & sealed & Delivered In the presence of

Item My will and desire is that all my estate not already given a way to be sold and after the payment of my Just debts the residue to be given in the following manner to wit ten pounds to my son Robert & two pounds to my son Stephen Malone when they come to the age of twenty one years &c. should there be an overplus it may go to the support of my living wife & three youngest Children
