 ed land by me before given to my son William, I say unto  
 my son James Winborne his heirs & assigns forever
- Item* I give unto my son Jose Winborne all that tract of  
 land that I purchased of Jacob Bapt. containing one  
 hundred acres more or less, I say unto my son Jose Winborne  
 his heirs & assigns forever.
- Item* I give the Quaker unto my son Jose Winborne two saws &  
 Calves & also my feather bed & furniture I say to my son  
 Jose Winborne his heirs & assigns forever
- Item* I give the Quaker unto my three Daughters Jane, Esther & Anne  
 Winborne each of them ten pounds a piece  
 Current money of Virginia, I say unto my three  
 Daughters of or said thirteen & assigns forever.
- Item* My will & desire is that all my Lands in Virginia shall
