In the name of God Amen. William Morgan of Northampton County being very sick & Crazy but of sound mind do make & Ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form as follows

- Item I give & bequeath unto my son Joseph Morgan all the land that I am now possessed of after my death & my wife dead or if I should hood. I likewise give him all my Stock of Cattle & Hags, I likewise give him all my moveable Estate that he now possesses of. I likewise give him my man & bridle saddle
- Item I give to my son Joseph Morgan the above mentioned articles to him & his heirs forever

Item I give to my son John Morgan one Shilling & three Pence.

Item I give to my son Arnold Morgan one Shilling & three Pence.

Item I give to my son Sampson Morgan one Shilling & three Pence.

Item I give to my son Aaron Morgan one Shilling & three Pence.

Item I give to my son Timothy Morgan one Shilling & three Pence.

Item I give my daughter Mary Toler one Shilling & three Pence.

I likewise constitute make my son Joseph Morgan my sole &

Sole Executor of this my last will & Testament. In witness

Richard Moore's Will

In the name of God Amen. Richard Moore of the Precinct North Carolina in the County of Northampton being sick & in a declining condition do make & Ordain this to be my last will & Testament in manner & form following vizt. First. I commend my soul to Almighty God the giver, and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and touching my worldly Estate I give & bequeath as follows

- Item I leave to my Mother Tabitha Standish two negroes named Daniel & Lot during her natural life, after my Mother's death my eldest daughter is that all my Estate both real & personal Lands & Negroes. Should be sold & the amount of the same to be equally divided between my Brothers & Sister

And I do hereby appoint my Brothers William Moore & Nathaniel Moore my Executors to this my last will & Testament and I do hereby revoke all other made heretofore, either by word or writing. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Twentieth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & forty five.
