

William Vasworthy 1776

In the name of God Amen I William Vasworthy of Orange  
County in the Province of Carolina, being sick & weak but in  
perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God, do make  
& ordain this my last will in manner following to wit  
I give & bequeath my soul to God that gave it & my body to the  
earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter  
named, I give & bequeath to my daughter Peggy Vasworthy  
all my lands whereon I now live to her & her heirs forever  
with all the rest of my Estate of what nature or kind soever  
wher this wills forever, & I do lastly appoint my daughter  
Peggy Vasworthy my whole sole executrix of this my  
last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand & affixed my seal this 29<sup>th</sup> day of June 1779  
in the Province of North Carolina

John Brittle 1780

In the name of God Amen I John Brittle of the County of No  
rthampton in State of Carolina, being in perfect health &  
sound memory (thanks be to God for it) knowing it is appo  
inted for all intents, do make & ordain this my last will  
& testament as follows.

- I give & bequeath unto my son Jesse Brittle this his forever  
three hundred acres of Land together with the plantation where  
on I now live, also two negroes Jeffrey & Hannahs first child  
of Castle & two feather beds & furniture in case my son Jesse  
die without lawful issue, my will & desire is that the 1/2 of my  
say fall to my son Britain Brittle & his heirs forever.
- I give & bequeath unto my son Britain Brittle this his

this his forever two hundred & thirty acres of Land joining  
the land & plantation given to my son Jesse Brittle, also  
a orchard lying on the River on a tract of land also two ne  
groes Dick & Teller two feather beds & furniture & five head  
of cattle In case my son Britain die without lawful issue  
my will & desire is that the 1/2 of my say fall to my son Jesse Brittle  
& his heirs forever.

- I give the use of one hundred acres of Land to the same more  
or less & bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at Howell's Run  
in a corner on Dick's Branch thence along Dick's Run to a  
corner of Boy's Branch thence along Branch's line to a point  
standing in the Jeffrey Run thence along a line of marked  
trees to a point standing in the Buzzard Branch thence over  
the 2<sup>d</sup> Branch to Dick's Branch & down the summit to the first  
station to my son Jesse Brittle & wife during life, & after each  
of their decease give the said land to my grandson How  
ling Brittle this his forever in case my grandson How  
ling die without lawful issue my will & desire is that  
the said land fall to my grandson Phillip Brittle this his forever.
- I give & bequeath unto my daughter Milla Harborage one negro  
boy called Noah one horse & one saddle & one bed of furniture  
to her & her heirs forever. And in case my daughter Milla die  
without lawful issue my will & desire is that the 1/2 of my say  
fall to my son Jesse this his forever.
- I give & bequeath unto my son William Brittle this his forever  
one hundred pound current money of Virginia.
- I give & bequeath unto Sarah Brown one hundred pound current  
money of Virginia one feather bed & furniture also one horse  
& one saddle to her & her heirs forever.
- My will & desire is that after all my just debts are paid that all  
the remainder part of my Estate of all kinds whatsoever be  
equally divided between my son Jesse & Britain Brittle.
- I do constitute & appoint my sons Jesse Brittle & Britain my whole  
sole executrix of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof
