 to death when it shall please God to call on me, make & ordain this
 to be my last will & testament in manner & form following

 & movable Estate during her widowhood & after her old age
 hood, I give to her this be my one feather bed & furniture
 one Horse saddle and large pair of silk two Barons skin

 vince of North Carolina being in perfect health of perfect mind & memory
 (thanks be to God) Calling to mind the mortality of my body & know-
 ing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain
 this my last will & testament, that is to say principally I give
 & recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it & my body I
 recommend to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the di-
 cretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General resur-
 rection I shall rise the same again by the mighty power
 of God & as touching such worldly Estate which death it has pleased
 God to bless me with in this life I give & dispose of in the
 following manner of use first of all my estate & estate is that my debts
 be collected by my Executors & all my just debts be paid.
 Item I give leguath unto my Supposed Son, Bailey Hardison son of
 Anne Hardison one thousand pounds Virginia money to be kept
 in the hands Thomas Edwards Treasurer & according to the said Hardison
 Item I give leguath unto my sister Charity Pope four hundred pounds Virginia
 money to be paid her at the age of twenty one years to her husband
