Item I give & bequeath to my son William Buffalaw one feather bed furniture
to him my son William Buffalaw his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Matthew Buffalaw my feather bed furniture
to him my son Matthew Buffalaw his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Ruth six pound gold & silver coin

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy Buffalaw six pound gold
& silver coin. To be paid to them at twenty years of age or on the day of
marriage & to be that my Daughter Ruth or Lucy shall die
before they marry or come to twenty years of age my will is that
the survivor of them shall have the other legacy which I give to them
here heirs forever.

Item My will is that the negro man Lang the iron master shall labor for the
support of my before named Children, after my children, in case of
diseaseth that then the Negro Lang the iron master shall pay back of all kinds
of all my household goods excepting the lot of feather bed & furniture
I have already given away to equally divided among my other
children to them their heirs & assigns forever.

And Lastly I appoint my son Matthew Buffalaw & my friend John Webb Jr &
my whole sole executors to this my last will & testament making & remanding
making back all ^{the} ~~all~~ ^{the} will he before made by me in writing
whereof I have put my hand & signed my seal this 21 day January 1765

same time Matthew Buffalaw & John Will Jr were qualified
executors thereof on motion was ordered to be certified
& recorded.

Samuel Perkins. I Will

In the name of God, the tenth day of December, in the year of our Lord
Christ one thousand seven hundred and forty four Samuel Perkins
of Northampton County in North Carolina being sick of weak in
body, but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be to almighty God
& calling to remembrance the uncertain state of this transitory life
& that all flesh must yield to death when it shall please god to
call, do make & ordain & declare this to be my last will & testament
in further settling of my temporal estate, all debts & dues as same
to be paid within convenient time after my decease by my executors
hereafter I give & dispense in manner following:

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Perkins two head of young
Cattle & also a ^{new} iron Pot one Pint Pasture Bacon two plates one dish
one linen cloth to her the heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Perkins two head of
young Cattle & one iron Pot one Pint Pasture Bacon two plates one dish
one linen cloth to her the heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Jeremiah Perkins two head of young
Cattle & one iron Pot one Pint Pasture Bacon two plates one dish & one gun to him this
heir present & also one hundred & twenty six acres of land, to be sold,
beginning at the Poplar branch, one acre to be sold to him.

Item I give & bequeath unto my wife Belinda wife Mary Perkins one mare &
one Cow living with Calf & all the Hogs belonging to the Plantation
all the Corn & Peas, two Sifters & all the rest of my Pewter & two sets
her bed furniture, two Chests, one Table a Can of Knives, & a Shear
& Chair and tray all my books, only a prayer book & Bible & Testaments
I give unto my son in law John Purvis, and also I give unto my wife
one dooler about two pair of Cards one box & theater a powdered
Spur Cedar barrels one arbor & Pough all lying unto my son
Samuel Perkins my Master Plantation whereon I may live to take
it at the age of twenty one & of this my last will & testament which
I make, ordain & appoint my well beloved Mary Perkins Virgin
Daughter Robert Purvis my whole executors recording & annealing
all other forms or Wills by me made, Confirming this & none other
to be my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto

Set my hand and Seal this day & year first written of return.

in presence of us Testis Joseph Lister, Joseph Hunter, Notary Public
Northampton County February Court 1765.

John Edwards' Will

In the name of god Amen I John Edwards of Northampton County in the
Province of North Carolina being of sound mind & memory thanking to
Almighty God to make & ordain this my last will & testament.

I first command my soul to Almighty God in full hope of a future happy
repose my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion
of my executors my usual estate & place of my following Manner
I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Edwards all my land lying in Roanoke
County from this his forever alato negroes payable to him this his forever
I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Edwards two negroes names Patima
Whitie, and bid & furnish her to her heirs forever

I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Edwards two negroes Chapp
Charles and bid & furnish her to her heirs forever.

I give & bequeath to my loving wife Sarah Edwards three negras Jack Beck
Luke the Plantation where I now live inhabiting the land, by a
line of trees midway between the Plantation fence & the new
Corn field fence made by my father John Edwards during
the continuance of the lease, also my land up to Bear Swamp together
with all the remainder of my estate after my just debts & funeral ex-
penses are paid. I say to her this his forever.

I give to my Father John Edwards that part of my land where his
old Corn field stands divided by the line mentioned in the preced-
ing legacy during the continuance of the original Lease.

It is my Will & desire that all my just debts & expenses be first paid
by my executors & what sum money shall remain in the

hands of my executors to be equally divided between my wife & three
children also my desire is the signature bequeathed my two daughters
Mary & Elizabeth may be delivered to each of them when they arrive
at the age of eighteen years on the day of marriage by either
of my three children Thomas, Mary, or Elizabeth Shuster etc
before that they come to age or may not that the whole shall
be divided between the survivor or survivors of them.

I do hereby nominate & appoint James Daney & Thomas Hunter exec-
utors of this my last will & testament, ratifying & confirming the
same. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred & ninety four. John Edwards my legal
