

- Item I give & bequeath to my son Jesse Judkins one Certain Plantation lot or parcel of Land Containing by Estimation less than one hundred & fifty acres situate lying in the Kings Creek rise one feather Broad Run near to him this heirs & his heirs forever.
- Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Judkins Sixty pounds hard Money one feather Broad Run near to her heirs & his heirs forever.
- Item My will & desire is that all my horses, except my Stallions, should be Equally divided between my Sons John, Paul, Cornelius & Jesse.
- Item provided always & it is my will & desire that if any of my Children should die without Issue of their own Body what I have above bequeathed to them may return into my Estate.
- Item as for the negroes now in my property I think proper in this my last will to declare that I claim them not any part of my Estate but desire that they may if permitted enjoy their just right of Freedom.
- Item all the remainder of my Estate of all kinds I desire may be Equally divided between all my Children.
- Item I lend all my Estate of all kinds to my loving wife Mary Judkins for & during her natural life.
- Item I lend to my son Jesse Judkins one negro Boy named Sam until he arrives to the age of twenty one year.
- Item I lend to my Daughter Sarah Judkins one negro Girl named Grace until she arrives to the age of eighteen years.
- Item I do constitute & appoint my Friends John Knox Richard Jordan to execute this my last will & testament: witness my hand & seal this 22nd day of the 2nd month 1783.

- This will was proved at the oath of Abraham Stinson one of the subscribing witnesses. The executor appointed by the testator refusing to act Administration was granted to William Judkins with the will annexed. Ordered the same to be Certified & recorded. Test Jeph A. Thurston C^t

Benjamin Pattersons Will

- I Benjamin Patterson of Northampton County in Province of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind & memory do make & publish this my last will & testament in manner & form following viz
- First I give & bequeath unto my Beloved wife Elizabeth Patterson this Plantation whereon I now live during her life in full & sole possession.
- Item I give & bequeath unto my son Benj Patterson the land & house on the next line containing twenty acres more or less taken this heirs forever.
- Item I give & bequeath unto Mrs David Smatham Patterson the land whereon I now live containing three hundred acres more or less to be Equally divided. Between the Plantation whereon I now live from the part whereon he now lives & divide the other part to them & their heirs forever.
- Item I give & bequeath unto my son Joseph Patterson one feather Broad Run to him & his heirs forever.
- Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Patterson one part of Stearboard & the flax hackle to him forever.
- I leave the rest of my Estate for the support of my wife & son Robert Patterson during their lives & after their Deaths to them that have the care of the said Robert to them & their heirs forever.
- Lastly I appoint my two eldest Sons John Benj Patterson Executors of this my last will & testament Ratifying & Confirming this & only this to be my last will hereby revoking all other wills by me made & at this time whereof I have heretofore set my hand & fixed my seal this 26th day of April 1782.
