

Item I give Augu[m]ath to my son Jeph Judkins one Coloured Man
laborer boy or girl of Sixe Containing by Estimation one
hundred fiftty acres of land lying on the West Branch river
one feather bed & furniture to him this his wife his son & his son's
wife

Item I give Augu[m]ath to my daughter Faith Judkins Sixty pounds
hard Money One feather bed & furniture to her her Husb[and]
& children forever.

Item I give all & leave is that all my horses except my stallion shall
be Equally divided between my Sons John, Isad, Caudel & you.

Item provide always & it is my will & desire that if any of my Child
or in Shal[e] die without issue of their own Body what I have
above bequeathed to them may return with my Estate

Item as for the negroes now before hand my property I think proper
in this my last will to declare that I bequeath them not away from
of my Estate but desire that they may if permitted enjoy their
just right of freedom.

Item all the remainder of my Estate of all kinds I leave may be
Equally divided between all my Children.

Item I lend all my Estate of all kinds to my loving wife Mary Judkins
for bearing her natural life.

Item I lend to my Son Jeph Judkins one negro Boy named Sam
until he arrives to the age of twenty one years

Item I lend to my Daughter Faith Judkins one negroe girl named
Grace until she arrives to the age of eighteen years

Item I do constitute & appoint my Friends John & Isad Shishard
fiduciaries to execute this my last will & testament setting my
hand thereto the 22nd day of the second month 1783.

This will was proved at the Court of Abraham Stevenson one of the
subscribing witnesses the Deacon appointed by the testator
refusing to act administrator also granted to Mary
Judkins with the will annexed ordered the same to be

Benjamin Patterson Will

I Benjamin Patterson of Northampton County in Province of New-Hampshire
being weak in body but of sound mind & memory do make & ordain this my
last will & testament in manner & form following viz.

First I give Augu[m]ath unto my wife Elizabeth Patterson the Plantation
whereon I now live during her life in widowhood

Item I give Augu[m]ath unto my son Benj' Patterson the land wherein he
now lives containing Seventy acres more or less to him his heirs forever

Item I give Augu[m]ath unto Mr David Jonathan Patterson the land wherein
I now live containing three hundred acres more or less to
be Equally divided, Jonathan the Plantation whereon I now
live upon the part whereon he now lives & Maria the other part to
them & their Heirs forever

Item I give Augu[m]ath unto my son Joseph Patterson One feather bed
to him & his heirs forever

Item I give Augu[m]ath unto my son John Patterson One pair of Stu-
tts & the flea hookle to him forever

I leave the rest of my Estate for the support of my wife Mrs Robert
Patterson During their lives & after their death to them that has
the care of the old Robert to them & their heirs forever

Lastly I Appoint my two Eldest Sons John & Benj' Patterson Executors
of this my last will Testiment Ratifying & Confirming this
& only this to be my last will hereby revoking all other wills
by me made or witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & sealed my seal this 26th day of April 1782.
