given by her father a Black buckly at her gown & other
two dishes two basins and six plates of her choice also
One negro girl named Rhinok I lend to her during
her life or widowhood and of her her dower to be equally
divided amongst my children sold to the highest bidder
I also lend three cows and calves two sows and pigs
two head of young hogs during her life and at her
decease to be sold to the highest bidder the money
Equally divided as before mentioned also all the other
stock of hogs pigs cattle and sheep and to her
and One negro fellow Bodan and household
furniture to be sold at public sale and the
money arising to pay my debts and the remainder
equally divided between my two Daughters Nancy
Laskley and Rebecca Laskley

Item I do give and bequeath unto my son William
Laskley two Negroes Liza and Hannah to
and the tract of Land I am now possessed
with Pease Hill Creek to him and his heirs
forever

Item I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah
Laskley two Negroes Hannah & Betty to her and
her heirs forever

Item I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter
Rebecca Laskley One negro Maack Mittie
and her by and to her and her heirs forever

Item my will and desire is that all the Menthalls
belonging to the plantation use should
be left to them for the service of my wife
such as plows Axes broad and narrow Hoes
to her ^{heirs} and assigns forever and I
do hereby make and Revocate all former

wills heretofore made by me or others and I do
hereby appoint my friend Oliver Myrick and
James Johnston my whole and Sole Executors
of this my Last will and Testament

Mark Philips Will

In the Name of god Amen I Mark Philips of
Hampton County in the province of South Carolina
being sick in body but in perfect sense &
of sound understanding do make this my last

ten pounds current money of Virginia after
my Just debts be paid for Satisfaction for
my being there sick for that time ^{gone}
and bequeath unto my living brother
Thomas Philips two Daughters one negro
boy Ohay and all the rest of my estate
Equally between them forever namely
Manning & Mottin & I do appoint my living
brother Thomas Philips my whole and
heir unto I have set my hand this 18th day

Elizabeth Fason's Will

In the name of god Amen, Elizabeth Fason
of Hampton County and province of the Carolina
being in perfect mind & memory thanks be to god
calling to mind the mortality of the body and
knowing that it is appointed for all persons
once to die & make and ordain this my last will
and testament in manner following that is to
say principally that is to say and first of all
I give and recommend my soul to the almighty
that gave it me and my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner
at the discretion of my Executors Nothing
Doubting but at the general Resurrection I
shall receive the same again by the almighty
power of god to help me in this life I give
& devise and dispose of the same in the
following manner first of all my will and
desire is debts be collected by my Executors
and all my just debts to be paid

Item I give and bequeath my son Henry Fason
five shillings

Item I give and bequeath unto my son James
Fason five shillings and the place therein
whereon I dwell if he ever comes to inherit
it and if he don't come to it I give the
land to my son William Fason forever

Item I give to my son William Fason one bay
mare forever

Item I give to my son William Fason and
my daughter Leah Fason all my
stock of cattle sheep and hogs and household

goods to be divided between them and also I
appoint and constitute Edward Wilson Junr and
Nathan Stancel Executors to see this my last
will & testament performed I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 4th day of December 1778

widowhood afterwards to my daughter Phebe
to her and her heirs forever the other half to
my son David and his heirs forever I also
nominate and appoint my wife and Solon
Patterson Executors of this my last will and
testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand this twenty ninth day of March
One thousand seven hundred & seventy eight
