- I give unto my son John Howells all the rest of my moveable estate of what ever kind it may consist to be sold for money and be kept for the said John Howells in the hands of my executor hereafter named, until the said John Howells shall be twenty years of age, & then my executor to account with him for the same & in case my son John Howells die before he arrives to full twenty years of age, then all his property of estate to fully & absolutely to pass to my daughter Manna Howells, and unto this my last will, I commend and appoint my friends Bryan Daughtery & Robert Fuller my executors, this twentieth day Jan'y 1742.
