boy Hardy, son of Joan, to her this time forever.

Item I give by my will unto my Daughter Elizabeth Sikes one negro
boy Charles, son of Nugg, to her this time forever.

Item I give by my will unto my Daughter Mary Sikes one negro
son son of Nugg, to her this time forever.

Item I give by my will unto my beloved wife William Sikes my negro
boy named Poot and bought of Ingram & Ingram wench Joan, also
I leave the labour of one negro boy Sawney son of Nugg, to my
wife during her widowhood, or until my son William
comes to the age of twenty one years, but if she marry, or
after death my will & desire is that my son William Sikes
shall have the negro Sawney immediately. I also leave the
Land I bought of James Cunningham, Jacob Segraves &
William Segraves jun. & the Gosden now in the town to my

thereof & all the money before mentioned of my Debt Col-
lected after my just debts being paid, then the money before
given to my said son is to be paid out of it & if any left
to be equally divided ^{among} all my sons & daughters

and wife, and all the Rest of my Stock Household Goods both
in Doors & out Doors I leave in Case of my wife for the raising of
my Children during the time she lives and after but if she mar-
ry then my will & desire is that it shall be equally divided
among all my sons & daughters then living and after, but if
my wife marry, Mary. I leave it to her for life, and then
to be divided among all my sons & daughters then living.

Item I give Nigumath unto my Daughter Mournie Sikes one negro boy Hardy son of Joan, to her this will for ever.

Item I give Nigumath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Sikes one negro boy Charles, son of Nugg to her this will for ever.

Item I give Nigumath unto my Daughter Mary Sikes one negro Boy son of Nugg, to her this will for ever.

Item I give Nigumath unto my beloved wife William Sikes my negro woman's pinner I bought of Ingram & negro woman Joan, also I do give the labour of one negro boy Sawney son of Nugg, to my wife during her widowhood, or until my son William comes to the age of twenty one years, but if she marry, or after death my will & desire is that my son William Sikes shall have the negro Sawney immediately. I also leave the Land I bought of James Cunningham, Jacob Segraves & William Segraves fur, & the Goods now in the Store to my wife William Sikes to be sold by her the money raising there of & all the money before mentioned of my Debt collected after my just debts being paid, then the over plus given to my said son is to be paid out of it if any left to be equally divided ^{among} all my sons & daughters

and wife, and all the Rest of my Stock Household Goods both in Doors & out Doors I leave in Case of my wife for the raising of my Children during the time she lives a widow but if she marry then my will & desire is that I shall be equally divided among all my sons & daughters then living and wife, but of my wife never marry I leave it to her for life, and then to be divided among all my sons & daughters then living.

Item I give hereunto unto my son William Hagland, two Negroes vizt. Hannibal Peter which I bought of Josias Crumpton, also one feather bed & furniture, also my best coat all which I give to my aforesaid William Hagland this heirs forever.

Item I give hereunto my son Stephen Hagland, one Negro fellow named Hardy, to him this heirs forever. I further give to my said son Stephen Hagland, ten pound Proclamation Money.

Item I give hereunto to my son Thomas Hagland one Negro boy named Solomon & ten pound Proclamation Money, to him this heirs forever.

Item my will & desire is that all my lands and other Estate of what kind or nature so ever, which I have not already given away, shall be sold at the discretion of my executors, & the money arising from the same & the money that is due to be equally divided between my three sons William Hagland Stephen Hagland & Thomas Hagland, after my just debts & funeral charges are discharged.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my brother William Hagland & John Nail my executors, of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 13th day of March 1771. George Hagland & seal signed sealed & attested as his last will & testament in presence of us John Richard, Thos Barrett, Thos Short.
