

In the name of God Amen, I give Pace of the County of Northampton & State of Carolina being of sound perfect mind & memory do this twenty first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty nine make & publish this my last will & testament in manner following that is to say,

I give my will to Mary Collins a negro woman to her & her heirs lawfully begotten from the day of my death or should she die before me the above mentioned negro to be the property of James Collins & his heirs forever.

It is my desire that James Collins do for me & in my name settle with & receive all the money due me from Mr. John Jones, then to pay all my just debts & the remainder I give my will to said James Collins & his heirs forever.

I give my will to Dorothy Cotton Pace a negro girl named Sue to her & her heirs forever and of the said Dorothy Cotton Pace should she leave no lawful issue then the above mentioned negro girl Sue is to be the property of Henry & Ann their heirs forever.

I give my will to my Brother Ned Pace a great coat & saddle & bridle to him & his heirs forever.

I give my will to my Brother James Pace two horses to him & his heirs forever. It is my desire that all the remainder of my estate that is not by this will bequeathed should be the property of James Collins which I give to him & his heirs forever. In witness whereof I have signed, sealed & delivered in presence of J. Davis Pace & signed, sealed & delivered in presence of Francis McGehee, my attorney from James McGehee, Father of James Collins, Deuter to this my last will & testament.

as Executor.

I Jesemich Beams of Northampton County in the state of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind & memory do make & renew this my last will & testament in manner & form following Now I give my will unto the family of the people called Quakers one acre of land where in the meeting house now standeth to them forever.

I leave to my dear wife during her life in widow hood the widow & remainder of my estate both real & personal, to certain my children or & after her marriage or death my will is that the Land shall be equally divided among st my five sons William, John, Eliot, Jesemich & Peter and the remainder of my estate to be equally divided amongst all my children.

I also nominate Constitution and appoint my wife Elizabeth & John Patterson & Peter May moon executors to manage of this my last will & testament & do hereby ratify & confirm this no other to be my will & testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 28th day of September, in the year 1788.
