Item I give Charles Roger, Son of Richard Roger one Coll Bridle Saddle, thence every thing to be sold & equally divided amongst these youngest Children of Richd Roger.

I do appoint Anna Roger to be & let her my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 20th day of January 1780. Angelica Lewis ^{markt} & seal being a Chaker John Epts, Lydia Chaker

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Roper all my lands lying on the north
side of the river pond Creek & my branch containing by Estimation
one hundred acres more or less to him his heirs or assigns forever.
Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Roper all my lands lying on the south side
Item I give & bequeath to my Beloved wife Sarah Roper during her life & to her husband all
the remainder part of my estate containing by Estimation two hundred
Twenty five acres more or less, nevertheless my will & desire is that when
my two sons Martin & William arrive at the age of twenty one, that
they shall not be bound of claiming & having the same.

Item I like wise bind my wife eight head of cattle six sheep & bay mare
ten hogs a feather bed & furniture Chamber of my House and all my
Kitchen Furniture during her life or as shee would. & after the
Death or marriage of my wife my will is that the above said
stock & furniture be sold & the money arising therefrom be
equally division between my sons, James, John, Benjamin, Martin
William Roper & Grand son Robert Short.

Item I do give & bequeath unto my negro woman Phyllis, during her
life or widowhood & after the death, or marriage of my wife
my will is, that the said negro together with his increase be
sold & the money arising therefrom be equally division between
my four sons, & Grand son Robert Short.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Rebecca forty pounds

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sally Roper forty pounds & a
feather bed & furniture.

Item I give & bequeath unto Daughter Isabella Roper forty pounds &
a feather bed & furniture.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Catron Roper forty pounds
& a feather bed & furniture.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Anna Roper forty pounds
& a feather bed & furniture or of Twenty pounds.

I then give & bequeath unto my son James Rock one of my Head
of Horses the Chair of my Stock except my boy man
I then my will & desire is that my negro woman Rachel together
with all the remainder of my Estate not heretofore given away
be sold & the money arising therefrom whatsoever I have
after paying two hundred & twenty pounds Rock, to my first
Daughters Rebecca, Sarah, Sabitha Cuttron & Anna, being
their part of 40 to be equally divided between my Sons.

James, John, Benjamin, Martin, William Rock & Grand
son Robert Rock & I do ^{appoint} my two Sons John &
Benjamin Rock, executors of this my last Will & Testament
Respecting all other wife heretofore by me made. In ait
exp whereof I have hereto set my hand & seal the day

Thomas Sawyer Will

In the name of God Amen. Thomas Sawyer of Northampton County
State of N. Carolina being sick & weak & calling to mind
the certainty of death the uncertainty thereof do make &
relinquish my last Will in manner following.

- 1st It is my will & desire that all my just debts be discharged at the execution
time of my decease after manner
- 2nd I give & bequeath unto my daughter Francis Heath one negro girl named
Doll to her heirs forever
- 3rd I give & bequeath unto my grandson Samford Sawyer one negro
boy boy named Abram to him & his heirs forever.
- 4th It is my will & desire that all my negroes that I have not
given away be kept together to maintain my family

until my Son Thomas Sawyer comes of age & then to be equally divided
by an order of Court amongst my following Children, Sarah Sawyer,
Henry Sawyer, Thomas Sawyer & William Sawyer to have & share alike,
to them their heirs forever.

- 5th I likewise give my son Henry Sawyer one bed & furniture to him &
his heirs forever
- 6th I likewise give my daughter Sarah Sawyer one bed & furniture
to her heirs forever
- 7th I likewise give & bequeath to my son Thomas Sawyer one Bed & furniture
to him this heirs forever
- 8th I likewise give & bequeath to my son John Sawyer one bed & furniture
to him his heirs forever
- 9th It is likewise my will & desire that if my just debts can not be
paid without Selling my Stock, that my Stock shall be sold
& all my household Furniture that I have not given away by
will, & after my just debts being paid, if any overplus
shall be remaining, my desire that it shall be equally
divided amongst all my fore mentioned Children to them
their heirs forever.
- 10th I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Sawyer One hundred & fifty
Acres of Land on the North side of what is now known as the
Swamp, it being the land I purchased of Charles Geddes to him this heirs
forever.
- 11th I give & bequeath unto my son John Sawyer Seven acres of Land
joining his line, scott line & Williamson's line, being part of a tract
of Land that I have taken up, on the river Grant to him this heirs
forever.
- 12th I then give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Sawyer one hundred & fifty
Acres of Land being part of a tract of Land I bought of Matthew
Eason Beginning at an old pine in the head of a marsh just above
the river, then running an East Course to the Pocson line of the said
Land, thence along the Pocson line a north course to the corner of
said line, then a west course along the old pine to another river
Swamp then down the river swamp to the first station to him
this heirs forever.
