

Robert Ruffin's Will

In the Name of God a men I Robert Ruffin of the County of Northampton & Province of North Carolina being in good health & of sound mind & memory for preventing Disputes which may arise in my family about the Estate it may leave at my death do make this my last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say.

I give & bequeath to my wife Anne the use of my plantation of Land I purchased of Samuel Ruffin & John Ellers Containing one hundred & eighty acres more or less during her natural life. Also the Labor of my Negroes past near Sampson Lake Daniel & Rachel during her natural Life I bequeath to my said wife ten Cows & Calves of her own year old & Stars, but I give my three best feather Bed & furniture to Sampson, one pair Provision for himself & Family, one Mare & two horses, the Choice of all the property of all the remainder of my household Goods. I do not give away by this will, one fourth part of all my ready Money, all the working Tools Carts & Ploughs belonging to me, all my Gear, all my Cedar Casks, her riding Saddle & Bridle.

I give & bequeath to my son William Ruffin & his Heirs apnys, for ever all my Lands in the Counties of Edgecombe & Northampton in the Province aforesaid, also my Brandy Still, our gun, my riding Saddle & Bridle & my weaning apparel.

I give & bequeath unto my Grandson Robert Ruffin, my negro girl Peggy.

I give & bequeath unto my Grandson Hett Warren, my negro girl Jane.

I give & bequeath unto my Granddaughter Anne Donick my negro girl Medilia one feather bed & furniture one horse or thirteen pounds six shillings & eight pence proclamation money, also ten pounds Burton Billings & four pence like money.

I give & bequeath unto Oliver Warren one feather bed & furniture also twenty pounds proclamation money.

I give & bequeath that Negro whose labor I have lent to my wife during her life, after her death to be equally divided between my three children, William, Anne & Oliver. My

will desirous is that they divide the negroes between themselves without selling any of them to any other person.

Item I give & bequeath to my two daughters Anna Smith & Oliver Warren all the remainder of my Stock of Cattle & Sheep to be equally divided between them.

Item I give & bequeath all the remainder of my Estate of what Nature or kind sever to be equally divided between my three Children William, Anne & Oliver, each to have an equal share apart.

Item My wife & I do give & positive orders that no part of my Estate be sold appraised or inventoried but that my wife & Children divide the same among themselves in Specie according to my death, any Law Custom or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

Item I nominate constitute and appoint my wife Anna & my son William Ruffin wife and sole executors of this my last will and testament making all former wills by me made, and declaring this only to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 28th day of March in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty seven signed sealed & delivered to be Robert Ruffin Esq: the last will & testament of the subscriber in presence of Henry Dawson, Mary Collier her mark John Hall.

Know all men by these presents that whereas I Robert Ruffin of the Province of North Carolina & County of Northampton have made & declared my last will & testament bearing a general date with this Schedule, I the said Robert Ruffin by this present Codicil or Schedule Confirm & ratify my said last will & testament excepting that provision that part of my said will by which I gave unto my wife Anne only the one fourth part of my ready money, I now intend in this room & stead of the aforesaid one fourth part of my ready money given & bequeath unto my living wife two hundred & fifty Pounds in Gold part of the ready money I have by me,

Item I give & bequeath unto my grandson Robert Haffen fifty
Pounds in hard Money, That is to say in Gold & Silver
My will & meanings that this Codicil or Schedule to
be adjudged to be part and parcel of my said last will
Testament and that all things herein contained & mentioned
be faithfully & truly performed, and as fully & amply in
my respect as of the same were so declared & drawn
in my said last will & Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this
28th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand
sever hundred & Sixty Seven Robert Haffen & seal

& weak of body, but of sound & disposing mind & memory
Thanks be given to almighty God for the same, do make &
renew this my last will & Testament in manner &
form following that is to say first Principally I re-
commend my soul into the hands of almighty God that
you it trusting to receive the same again at the last
day with full & free pardon of all my sins thru the merits
& mediation of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ
My body I commit to the Earth to be decently interred
at the discretion of my Executors execution hereafter

named & so far such worldly Goods & chattels as it hath
pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me & given over &
bequeath the same as follows etc.

Item I will that all my just debts funeral charges be paid
& discharged.

Item I give & bequeath unto my wife Anne
Wimberly the use of two Negroes vizt, Coff & Ann, likewise
one half of my moveable Estate during the life of said Wimberly

Item Give & bequeath unto my son Bryan Wimberly my
manor Plantation likewise one hundred acres of land
adjoining the rest that I have of William Haffen, but
I give unto my grand son David Sonciano one hundred
acres of land adjoining to Doctor Samuel Peters Land & Alexander
Lewis. Also one bed & furniture. But of the said Sonciano
not less to the year of twenty One, the said hundred acres
of my Plantation I give to my son Bryan & the bed & furniture
to my Daughter Anne Wimberly. Likewise during my tract
of land lying in the piny woods may be equally divided
between my two sons Bryan Wimberly & James Wimberly
Likewise give unto my son Bryan after my wife deceased
my negro Coff Likewise give to my son Bryan & James
Wimberly my Still Cap & worm tubs & their fixtures forever

Item I give & bequeath unto my son James Wimberly the Plantation
he now lies in and one Negro girl named Dell thereto
added to him his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary one
Negro boy named Caesar, and after my wife has one
half of my moveable Estate I give to Mary one half of the
remainder to her other heirs forever.

Item Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Wimberly after
my wife deceased the negro woman Ann thereto added
& the other half of the moveable Estate to her other heirs forever.

Item Give & bequeath unto said John son of my Brother
William Wimberly two hundred pounds proclamation money to be
paid out of my moveable Estate before it is divided to him the heirs
forever
