Murtha Rutlands Will

In the name of god our saviour I Murtha
Rutland of Northampton County State of
North Carolina being of sound health and
a disposing mind and memory do constitute
this my last will & Testament in the manner
of writing above Imprimis I give the whole unto
my beloved daughter Milana Fosman one negro boy named Eliz
to her and her husband unto my beloved son
John Rutland one waggon by name of Atom
to him and his heirs to posterity forever
I give to bequeath unto the grand daughter
Martha Cobb a negro girl named Sarah to
her & her heirs forever but if my said Grand
daughter Martha Cobb should die before
the comes of age or marries then I give the
said Negro to the next child she has my
daughter Elizabeth Cobb may have either
girl or boy it is my will that this gift
may not take place until the death of
my Daughter Elizabeth Cobb that she
may have the use of said girl as long
as she lives I also give unto my Daughter
Elizabeth Cobb her chest of Boxes soon to
her to her heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my Son John Rutland
One feather Bed & Furniture to him &
his heirs forever.
Item I give to bequeath unto my living Daughters
Bimina & Benson living friends it being
the Will of the Testator that her from her father's estate
Item I leave negro wench used to service of my
estate not heretofore given away to be left
by my Executors and the money so arising
after my last debts paid to be equally
divided between my four Children vizt
Benson Rutland John Rutland Simon
& Elizabeth Cobb to share and have alike
to them their heirs & assigns.
I do constitute & appoint my friend Henry
Augustine Wood and my Son John Rutland
of me whole sole Executors of this my last
will & Testament disallowing disannulling
and utterly revoking all other wills &
Testaments by me heretofore made pronounci
ng and declining this to be my last
will & Testament on which day I have
hereunto set my hand and seal the 24
day of November 1791
