Thomas Paer's will

In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Paer of the County of Northampton
being sick in body but of sound mind & memory be it God
do this fourth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and sixty four. Make & publish this my last will & Testament in manner follow-
ing, that is to say,

I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Ann two Negroes Bob & Jane
also one feather bed & furniture one silver Man & Maid & Diamond also
four Purses Dishes two Purses Basins & six Purses Plates also the use
use of my Manor & Plantation whereon I now live during her widow-
hood & if she should marry then I give her the use of my Plantation
Land the rents belonging on them till in lieu of her Dower.

I then I give & bequeath unto my daughter Alice one Negro Girl named Di-
nah fifty Pounds Virginia Money.

I then I give & bequeath unto my son Nathaniel this his forever. My
Plantation & Land the rents belonging thereon by the Name of my
old Plantation & whereon I formerly lived all the time my son Will Linder Warah.

I then I give & bequeath unto my daughter Joanae two Negroes, one & a Case,

I then I give & bequeath & desire to my son Thomas the Plantation whereon
I now live & the Land the rents belonging thereon two Negroes John & Peter
I lay to him & his heirs forever.

I then I give & bequeath to my daughter Long one Negro girl named.

I then I give bequeath & desire to my son Richard this his forever my first
Mill Plantation on Cod's Creek & all the Land thereunto belonging &
also two Negroes & Cedar

I then all the Rent & Dividend of my goods chattels & Personal estate I can may
be applied to the payment of my debts, and after debts paid if there should be
any surplus I desire that the same may be divided equally among my children

And lastly I make & give my son Mathew sole Executor of this my will & my friends shall
order an order or ^{Warrant} to a just my said Executor to carry out my said will
performed. And that he give of the said Thomas Paer & so to this my
last will & Testament set my hand & seal the day year above written
Signed sealed & published by the said Thomas Paer & I seal

subscribe our names as witnesses in the testator's presence at his Request

First & Principally I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God, hoping
thro the Merits Death & Passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have for
Pardon of all my sins & my body I commit to the ground to be buried
 decently by my Executors hereafter named.

I then I give & bequeath to my son Matthew Buffalow all the upper part of my
land on Upper's Mill Swamp beginning at a Turkey oak & running
up the said Swamp to a branch then up the said branch to a
line then along this said line to a corner on a six o'clock from thence a
straight course to the beginning to my son Matthew Buffalow his heirs forever.
