Item I give & bequeath unto my wife beloved friend Elizabeth Ellis one small tract or parcel of land bounded between Davis Woods Robert Ellis & John Manders Line and all the rest to my estate whether Goods Chattels or ready money to her the best of my power.

Lastly I constitute ordain & appoint my wife beloved friend Elizabeth Ellis my sole Exec. of this my last Will & Testament Recording & making vs'd all other or former wills by me hitherto made. ### Joseph Vining Will

In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Vining of Northampton County in Province of North Carolina being sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thank be given unto God calling unto mind the mortallity of my body and knowing that it is apparent to all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & testament, that is to say principally first of all I give & command my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and

my body I command to be earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my executors. Nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God, & continuing such worldly Estate where with I hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of the same in the following manner & form First of all my will & desire is that my debts are to be paid by executors my just debts paid out of them.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son James like my Plantation tract of land I bought of William Dawson to him this his forever also give him my said son James my negro boy named Tom & one negro girl named Hannah to him & his heirs forever. Likewise give him eight head of cattle & six breeding sows, six head of sheep and one grey horse. Cattle & stock & negroes is to be kept on the Plantation till my said son James comes of the age of twenty one years in order for him to receive. Also give him my Gun that I bought of Samuel Edwards.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Thomas like my Plantation tract of land I bought of Saml. Davis the Plantation tract of land I bought of John Gay to him this his forever also give to my said son Thomas one negro boy Ben & one negro girl Phillis the children of Saml. to him this his forever. But my beloved wife is to have the labour of the girl Phillis during the time she lies widow or till my said son Thomas comes of the age of twenty one years. I also give him my said son Thomas the cattle now on the Plantation in possession of John Ingram six head of sheep & four breeding sows, & the said stock is to be kept on the Plantation till my said son comes of age twenty one years in order for him to receive them and I also give him one of the saddles that Joseph Vining is to make & my great gun.

Item I give & bequeath to my son William like my plantation where I now live in tract of land I bought of Robert Williams & the remainder of my land joining Samuel Edwards & John Ash, Thomas sister up the Creek to the little swamp to him this his forever but

leaving my mother her liberty of a House & part of the Land her  
life for her own use.

And my beloved wife I leave her the use of my Plantation & tract of  
Land that I bought of Robert Williams during her life  
or widowhood, but if she marry she is to have but her thirds  
for life of that tract of Land. I also give to my said son William  
one negro wench named Nugg but my beloved wife is to have  
the labour of the said wench during her life or widowhood, but if  
my wife marry the said negro wench Nugg is to be my said  
son William's Property immediately. I except the in case  
of the wench that is now born, but the care of her from the  
making of this will shall be my son William's Right, to him this time forever.

Item I give the quanath unto my daughter Millieon Harris one negro  
boy Peter I bought of William Hobbs to her her heirs forever.

I also give her one woman's saddle, the riddle & four head of Sheep that  
she has now in Possession. I also give her one feather bed & furniture

Item I give the quanath unto my daughter Mourning like one negro  
boy Hardy son of John, to her her heirs forever.

Item I give the quanath unto my daughter Elizabeth Sikes one negro  
boy Charles, son of Nugg to her her heirs forever.

Item I give the quanath unto my daughter Mary Sikes one negro  
boy son of Nugg, to her her heirs forever.

Item I give the quanath unto my beloved wife Millieon Sikes my Negro  
domestic poster I bought of Ingram Long a wench John, also  
I leave the labour of one negro boy sawing son of Nugg, to my  
wife during her widowhood, or until my son William  
comes to the age of twenty one years, but of the money, or  
after death my will & desire is that my son William Sikes  
shall have the negro sawing immediately. I also leave the  
Land I bought of James Cunningham Jacob Sikes &  
William Sikes son, & the Goods now in the store to my  
wife Millieon Sikes to be sold by her other money raisings  
therein & all the money before mentioned of my debts cal-  
culated after my just debts being paid, then the money before  
given to my children is to be paid out of it & of any left  
to be equally divided between all my sons & daughters

and wife, and all the rest of my Stock Household Goods Books  
in Doors & out Doors I leave in Case of my wife for the raising  
of my Children during the time she lives a widow but of the man-  
y things my will & desire is that it shall be equally divided  
among all my Sons & Daughters then living and after but of  
my wife never marry I leave it to her for Life and then  
to be divided among all my sons & daughters then living.  
And I also appoint & constitute my dear beloved wife Millieon  
Sikes & William Sikes & John Sikes to be to see this my  
last Will performed. I have hereunto set my hand & affix  
to my seal this 29<sup>th</sup> day of May 1770 Joseph Sikes &asual  
Signed sealed & delivered by the said Joe. Sikes as his last will &  
testament in the presence of us

Item I give the quanath unto my daughter Mary equal one negro girl  
named Sina, & a Negro fellow named Peter to be their heirs  
forever, likewise I give to my aforesaid Daughter ten pounds  
Virginia money, due small from her.
