I give <sup>land</sup> to my wife beloved Wife during her widowhood my Plantation where I now live & the negro fellow James & all my household furniture & my Crops that is now standing & all working tools that is therein, & a horse & man & Caid & Calf, and at her Departure. Item, I give the right to my wife beloved son Harri's Jordan, the Plantation & all my tools, such as Carpenters & Joiners, Coopers & Shaw makers tools, & an equal part of my other moveable Estate. It is my desire also that my moveable Estate may be sold & equally divided between my son & daughter, and if my fathors will is not proved, that the Land fall to me or mine, it is my desire that my Brother Samuel Jordan's four Children Mary & John & Burrel & Michael Jordan, that there should be fifty pound equally divided among them, & I like wise if that will is not proved of my fathors, I give to my Brother Jordan twenty pound to settle all the affairs, <sup>nothing more in more than a poe order, & a certificate</sup> and if my Legacies that I have mentioned to my Brother's Children to be void & of no Command.

I do appoint my wife Elizabeth W of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 12<sup>th</sup> day of Sept 1769.

I give in I give my soul to almighty God, its Creator, hoping thro<sup>u</sup> the mediation of my Saviour Jesus Christ to receive full & abundant Remission for all my sins, my body I give to be decently interred at the discretion of my dear & hereafter appointed.

I give I give in I give unto my loving wife Martha Matthews, while she continues sole & my widow, all my Estate, but in case my wife should die & marry, I give my land to my son James Matthews <sup>his heirs forever, in case my son James Matthews should die under age, I give my land to my son Child some Matthews, & his heirs forever. in case my son Child some should die under age, I give my land to my son Lawrence Matthews, & his heirs forever.</sup>

I do constitute & appoint my wife Martha Matthews <sup>to be</sup> my Exec<sup>r</sup> of this my last will & Testament, & I do make my just debts to be paid by my Exec<sup>r</sup>, In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of April 1769.
