calling to mind that it is appointed for all men to die. I do
hereby make & ordain this my last will & Testament, hereby
recommending of my soul into the hands of my merciful de-
with it unto the profit of my Body to be buried at the Discretion of
my Executors herein after named. And as touching of my worldly
estate wherewith it has been pleased God to bless me with in my
just title of General to please being first paid by my said
Executors I give & devise of the same in the following manner.

- Item I give devise & bequeath unto my son William Bridges my
negro man named Jack. & my hand Mill to him his
heirs & assigns forever.
- Item I give devise & bequeath unto my son John Bridges my
negro woman named Rose & her increase from this
time to him his heirs & assigns forever.
- Item I give devise & bequeath unto my son William Bridges my neg-
ro man Jack to him his heirs & assigns forever.
- Item I give devise & bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth my
gray mare this Colt & my linen saddle & Bridle & my large
Chest & my new linen wheel & my Rachel Squares black
nut Table & two ewes & lambs and small Irons to her & her
heirs & assigns forever.

Item all the rest of my estate of what kind soever that is not herein my will
before given away & your devise & bequeath unto my two Daughters
Patience & Temperance to be equally divided between them, to them
their heirs & assigns forever.

Sadly I do hereby constitute & appoint William Ruffin & John Duke
& Richard Neal my whole & sole Executors of this my last will and
Testament hereby making null & void all former wills & testa-
ments by me made or made in this my last will & Testament.

John Amis's Will

In the name of God Amen I John Amis of Northampton County, being sick & weak of Body but of perfect Senes & memory praise be alway to God for the same. Do make Constitute & ordain this to be my last will & Testament in manner & form followeth.

- Item I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Amis two Negroes, Neph. Sam & Joseph which is all the Estate I intended for him.
- Item I give to my son William Amis my Land & Plantation at the death of my wife or Marriage to him this heirs forever.
- Item I give to my daughter Mary one Negro Girl named Phoebe like she. this heirs forever & ten pounds Virginia Money.
- Item I give to my Daughter Francis one Negro Girl named Sue to her. this heirs forever.
- Item I give to my Daughter Rachel one Negro Girl named Bet to her. this heirs forever.
- Item I give to my Daughter Margaret one Negro Girl named Rachel to her. this heirs forever.
- Item I give to my daughter Rebecca one Negro Girl named Jane & ten pounds to her. this heirs forever.
- Item I give to my Daughter Nancy one Negro Girl named Esther to her. this heirs forever.
- Item I give to my son William one Negro Boy named John to him this heirs forever.
- Item My will & desire is that if either of my Children die before they come of Age or marry, viz, Mary, Francis, William, Rachel, Margaret, Rebecca, or Nancy, that part of my Estate to be Equally divided between the Survivors or Survivors of them.

Item My will & desire is in case either of my Negroes die which I have already given to my six youngest Children, viz, Francis, William, Rachel, Margaret, Rebecca & Nancy before they come to a good Marriage, their part to be made good out of the Residue of my Estate.

Item I give to my loving wife Mary the remainder of my Estate during her life or widowhood to pay off my just debts & to support & educate my six youngest Children.

Item My will is at the death or marriage of my wife for the remainder of my Estate to be Equally divided among my seven youngest Children, viz, Mary, Francis, William, Rachel, Margaret, Rebecca & Nancy, to them & their heirs forever.

Lastly I appoint my loving wife Mary my executrix to this my last will & Testament & she hath fixed my hand and Seal this eighteenth day February, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred sixty four.
