In the name of God Amen, the third day of May in the year
of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred & Sixty, I Starling starting
in the province of Maryland & County of Northampton, being
weak in body but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be given
unto God for it, therefore taking to mind the mortality of my
body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I
make & ordain this my last will Testament, & first I
give & recommend my soul into the hands of God, that gave it
so freely I recommend it to the earth to be buried in
a decent like manner at the hand of my executors.

and whatsoever such worldly estate wherewith it hath been pleased
God to bless me with, I give & dispose as followeth in manner &
form.

I give first of all I give the plantation unto my son, John Starling, therefrom
I give unto my dearly beloved daughter Anne the old Plantation her
life of the world stay upon it, & afterwards to my son Abraham, to him this
heirs forever.

I give Sloughmath unto my son Abraham the plantation where I now live,
all the land belonging to it to him this heirs forever.

I give to my Daughter Mary ten shillings,

I give to my Son Thomas ten shillings,

I give to my Daughter Sarah ten shillings,

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth ten shillings,

I give to my Daughter Rachel ten shillings.

I give unto my dearly beloved wife Sarah all the rest of my whole
estate goods & chattels till death or marriage, then equally to
be divided between my sons Thomas & Abraham, & all my
Daughters after my debts are paid. Furthermore leave my
dearly beloved wife Sarah & my son Abraham my whole exec-
utors for to divide among them, and I do hereby disannul all
former wills & testaments by me before this time made, & confirm-
ing this & nothing to be my last will & testament in the presence of us
as witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal
the day & year first above written.
