I Francis Boykin of the County of Northampton in the Province of North Carolina being at present very sick & weak of body, but of perfect sound mind & memory thanks be to God, but calling to mind the mortality of my body do constitute & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following (that is to say) first & principally I Commit my soul unto the hands of God hoping to have full pardon of all my sins to inherit everlasting life, and as for my body I Commit it to the ground to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named; and as touching all such temporal estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give & dispose thereof as followeth.

Item I give & bequeath unto my ^{only} daughter Mildred Wall one ~~Quarter~~ ^{Share} of the land.

Item I give to my Grandson Samuel Boykin one Shilling & three Pence,

Item I give unto my Grandson Francis Boykin one Shilling & three Pence.
Item I give & bequeath all the residue of my Estate to my wife Sarah Boykin & my four Children.

and I do nominate and appoint my Son John Boykin my Son in law William Pace my heirs sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament revoking & annulling and making void all other Wills heretofore made by me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of August 1766.

I William Stevenson of the Province of North Carolina County of Northampton being very sick & weak but thanks be to Almighty God, of good sound disposing mind & memory calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life am willing to make my last Will in manner & form following (that is to say) first I give my soul to Almighty God that gave it me my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors and as touching my worldly Estate I give & bequeath as followeth. (viz) Item I give to the Child my wife Grace is big with Child with, my plantation wherein I now live and one hundred acres of land I bought of my brother Sifer Stevenson all the appurtenances of or belonging to both as well as all the land belonging to my said plantation to the said Child this or her heirs forever but of the said Child I have no issue it remains to lawfull age or married.

I give the above Slave to remain to my love Daughter
Charity Stevenson & Mary Stevenson with the appurtenances
thereto, to be equally divided between them to them & their
heirs forever

Item I give unto my Daughter Charity Stevenson my land and Planta-
tions I bought of Mr Hunter & my land in absolute Pauson
to her & her heirs forever

Item I give my land & improvements on fishing Creek to my Daugh-
ter Mary, to her & her heirs forever

One further my will & desire is that if all my said children
should die without issue that all my said land should
remain & descend to Mary Stevenson & Malley Stevenson
the two children my Sister Elizabeth bore before she
was married to Temperance Hunter to them & their heirs
forever

Item I give unto my loving wife my negro fellow called Robin
& my negro girl called Amy the two in ease to her &
her heirs forever

Item I give unto my daughter Mary Stevenson my negro boy
Cesar, also my negro girl called Peggy she & her increase
to her & her heirs forever

Item I give to my daughter Charity Stevenson my negro
wench called Sam my negro girl called Frank, them
and their increase also my negro boy called Jack to
her & her heirs forever

Item I give to the child my wife is now big with my negro
girls called Hannah & Denah them & their increase to the
said child & her heirs forever, also my negro boy called Dipier

Further my will & desire is my negro fellow called Old Jack
be sold & the money arising by such sale I give to my
daughter Charity, and my further will & desire is, that
all my debts where Virginia money is due be paid in
proclamation at thirty three & a half per cent, and
for the advantage of my Estate my will & desire
is that all my kil labls hogs & cattle be sent to

Virginia sold for money and that all the remaining part
of my Estate both real & personal of what kind it comes to
equally divided between my wife & children in & agree-
ment. I do nominate & appoint my two friends John
Pulle & Thomas Knox Executors of this my will, revoking
& disannulling all other wills by me made & this I own to
