unto my Legatees during his life or marriage and then to be  
equally divided amongst all my Children or the survivor  
of them. Thirdly I land my Land to my wife during  
her widowhood. Fourthly I give and bequeath to my  
son John Vaughan my Land and plantation and one  
half of my Turners tools and one Barn the smallest  
that I have to him and his heirs forever. Fifthly  
It is my will and desire that my Young mare and colt  
my Turners tools be sold by my Executor and the money put  
at Interest till my son Frederick Vaughan come to  
the age of Twenty one Years and then his Name to be  
given to him and his heirs forever.

Lastly I appoint John Law and John Vaughan  
of this my last will and Testament conforming this and  
only this to be my last will in witness whereof I have  
signed at my hand and affixed my seal this Eighteenth  
day of Oct 1779

#### Andrew Tarrow Will

In the name of God amen Andrew Tarrow of the County of North  
amplton State of N Carolina being of disposing mind & memory  
do constitute & ordain this my last will Testament & disposition  
of my worldly Estate as follows.

I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Tarrow an negro  
man named George & one bed & furniture now in the possession

of her husband Jacob Sparre to her her heirs forever  
I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Harris one negro Man named  
Peter & one Bed of furniture now in the possession of her husband  
Abraham Harris to her other heirs forever  
I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Boydon one bed of furniture  
I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Linda Law one negro  
boy named Moses & one bed of furniture now in the possession  
of her husband John Law to her other heirs forever  
I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Patience Tarrow one  
negro girl named Pig & her increase & one bed of furniture  
to her other heirs forever  
I give & bequeath to my Daughter Prue Tarrow one feather  
bed of furniture but also leave her one negro woman named  
Moll During her life & provision she marries I give the  
negro Moll but not her increase to her other heirs forever  
I leave unto my wife Elizabeth Tarrow one negro man  
named Kilipur & one negro woman named Dorothy  
During her widowhood

My will & desire is that all that part of my Estate both real  
Personal which I have not disposed of be continued in the  
hands of my son John Tarrow for the support of the brother  
until my youngest son comes to Lawful age & then  
to be equally divided amongst my four sons it is  
also my will that the negro Kilipur & Dorothy which  
I have left unto my wife be equally divided amongst  
the brothers when they decease from her & likewise that  
Moll During her increase be <sup>likewise</sup> equally divided amongst the four  
brothers And I do hereby nominate & appoint my son  
John Tarrow my whole estate exec of this my last will &  
testament In witness whereof I have signed sealed & delivered in  
in presence of,
