

- Item I give to him the said John Dawson this his forever my will & desire is that my loving wife Charity Dawson live on my Manour Plantation during her natural life she pay the house & other valuable improvements in reasonable repairs also I give to my son John my Clock & Chest upon a Chest ^{with} Drawers & two oval tables & one Chamber table which stands in the room called the Green Room, & my Carpeted King of lap which stands in the hall
- Item I give all my right title & interest to a girl called Sinah the African man forever to my daughter Elizabeth Dawson,
- Item I give to my loving wife Charity Dawson the negro wench called Fanny which was given to her by her decessed father,
- Item I will & desire is that my said wife have a negro boy named Runford if she will receipt of him in lieu of a negro fellow called Peter belonging to her estate which she paid the sale for forty five pounds Virginia money, if she will not receipt of the said boy for that fellow, my further will & desire is the said boy be sold to make out the sum of forty five pounds Virginia money for which the said fellow was sold for
- Item I give to my son Henry Dawson the following negroes to wit York Galweas & Sam. an Island & Mungo, Jacob George Gynn & Phillis the daughter of Siah, you my lady Morda to him the said Henry this his forever
- Item I give by my will all the rest of my negroes & their future increase to my three young children Charity Dawson, Elizabeth Dawson and John Dawson, to them & their heirs forever, to be equally divided when the first of the three children shall arrive to lawful age, or be married, & the profits of their sales if any to be equally divided likewise.
- Item I give by my will to my granddaughter Martha Kinchen & sister Kinchen Mary Kinchen & Temperance Kinchen thirty pounds Virginia money each to be paid out of my estate when they shall arrive at lawful age or be married,
- Item I give by my will to my two grandsons John Kinchen & William Kinchen ten shillings Virginia money each

- Item I give by my will all the residue of my estate after to the legacies are paid & my wife's Contract is completed with, to my three children Charity Dawson, Elizabeth Dawson & John Dawson to them & their heirs forever
 - Item I give by my will unto my loving wife Charity Dawson my riding chair & harness, also so nominated & appoynted my said loving wife Charity Dawson executrix of this my will, & this I do in full of my last will & testament, reserving & reserving all former or other wills or testaments by me made, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this day of Novr. One thousand six hundred & sixty seven

John Dawson Decedent was exhibited into Court, & proved in the oath of James Topey one of the subscribing witnesses at the same time Charity Dawson the executrix therein named qualified lawfully to execute the same, which in conclusion was ordered to be certified & recorded.

John Taylor's Will

In the name of God Amen I John Taylor of Northampton County being old & weak of body but of perfect mind & memory at this time I thank beget to almighty god therefore calling to mind the mortality of mans body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die & of what worldly estate it has left and god to bestow on me, I give by my will as followeth.

First I principally my soul to god that gave it, & my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors as I shall here after mention, & my funeral charges completed with, and all the remaining part of my estate I give by my will as follows

- Item I give by my will to my Cousin Richard Taylor five hundred shillings proclamaition money to be delivered immediately after my death.
- Item I give to my Cousin Nichol Bayly fifty shillings proclamaition money

Item I give & bequeath unto my trusty friend Sarah Gallings my land
 plantation wherein I now dwell containing two hundred
 acres, with all the appurtenances therunto belonging & all
 the remaining part of my personal Estate of all kind what
 ever when I constitute & appoint with the assistance of
 my Cousins Richard Bailey to be my full & sole Executors here
 of & this I do acknowledge & declare to be my last
 will & testament as witness whereunto I have set my hand &
 fixed my seal this 31st day of July in the year of our Lord 1758
 signed sealed in presence of us John Taylor ^{decedent} ~~decedent~~

 sign the same, at the same time Sarah Gallings was
 qualified & received in thereof which in matriculation was enter-

John Paul's Will

In the name of God amen. I John Paul of Northampton County &
 Province of North Carolina being sick & weak of body, but of perfect
 mind & memory do make this my last will & testament In witness
 my will & desire is that all my just debts & funeral expenses
 be first paid, after which the remainder of what is left
 hath pleased God Almighty to bestow on me, I dispose of in
 the following manner.

Item I lend to my beloved wife Sarah the use of my four Negroes, Patsy,
 Susan, Sue, Jack & Rose with their future increase during her
 natural life, about and to my said wife Sarah the use of my land
 & plantation wherein I now live, containing two hundred
 acres during her life & do bequeath and from & immediately after
 my said wifes decease, I give & bequeath my said four
 Negroes, Susan, Jack, Rose, together with their future

increase, as also the remainder part of my negroes namely, man
 Hannah, Aggy, Milla, Peg, Frank & just so with their future
 increase to be equally divided between my three Daughters Patsy,
 Patsy, and Betsy, to them & their heirs forever (and in case either
 of my said three Daughters should die without lawful heir, then
 it is my will & desire that all my said Negroes with their future
 increase be equally divided amongst the survivor or survivors
 of them and further it is my will & desire that after the decease
 of my said wife, my said lands & plantation be sold by my Executors
 for the best price that can be got for it & the money arising from
 the sale thereof to be equally divided among my said three (children
 down the survivor or survivors of them) The following I do
 omit to do, and further, it is my will & desire that my said
 children have liberty of working their negroes on my said pla-
 tation without paying rent or being molested.

Item I give & bequeath unto my sister in law Lucy, & am my boy man
 Colk.

Item It is my will & desire that all the rest of my personal Estate of what
 nature or kind soever, be sold by my Executors hereafter named
 for the best price that can be got for it & the money arising
 from the sale thereof be equally divided amongst my loving
 wife Sarah & my three children Patsy, Patsy & Betsy, the survivor
 or survivors of them

Item I give & dispose of the management & tuition of my said three
 Daughters Patsy, Patsy & Betsy, until they arrive to full age
 or marry, and them to please & dispose at any time as they shall
 think most proper

And lastly I do nominate & appoint my friend Thomas Hillburn
 and Thomas Amis senior Executors to this my last will & testament
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal, this twenty
 ninth day of May one thousand seven hundred & fifty seven,
 signed sealed & attested by the said
 John Paul, to be his last will
